blinking	Used to express annoyance. What a bally or blinking nuisance.

<u>exigent</u>	Pressing; demanding. Became more exigent over his pronunciation.
extempore	Without prior preparation. An extempore speech.
<u>flicker</u>	Shine unsteadily. A flicker of a smile passed across her face.
freshen	Make (to feel) fresh. It didn t take long to freshen her make up.
glance	Throw a glance at take a brief look at. She only glance d at the paper.
<u>grin</u>	Express with a broad smile. A silly grin .
immediate	Immediately before or after as in a chain of cause and effect. Coronary thrombosis was the immediate cause of death.
imminent	Close in time; about to occur. In imminent danger.
improvised	Created and performed spontaneously or without preparation; impromptu. An improvised short speech.
impulsion	A strong urge to do something. <i>Attitudes changed under the impulsion of humanitarian considerations.</i>



<u>instant</u>	Instant coffee. <i>We can t promise instant solutions.</i>
<u>instantly</u>	Urgently or persistently. She fell asleep almost instantly .
minute	The distance covered in a minute by someone driving or walking. A minute inspection of the grounds.
nadir	The point on the celestial sphere directly below an observer. Asking that question was the nadir of my career.
nod	Signify or express greeting assent or understanding by nodding. The teacher nod ded when the student gave the right answer.
offhand	With little or no preparation or forethought. She had made these remarks offhand edly.
provisory	Subject to a proviso. A provisory clause.
short	A short sound such as a short signal in Morse code or a short vowel or syllable. <i>The electrical circuit had shorted out.</i>
smile	Express with a smile. He smile d at Shelley.
sojourn	A temporary stay (e.g., as a guest. <i>Her sojourn in Rome.</i>
<u>sparkling</u>	(of a drink) effervescent; fizzy. <i>Sparkling</i> snow.
stopgap	Something contrived to meet an urgent need or emergency. <i>Transplants are only a</i> stopgap <i>until more sophisticated alternatives can work.</i>
temporarily	For a limited period of time; not permanently. Symptoms may disappear temporarily .
transitory	Not permanent. Love is transitory but it is eternal.
<u>twinkle</u>	(of a star or light, or a shiny object) shine with a gleam that changes constantly from bright to faint. <i>The smile made her face crease and her eyes</i> twinkle .
<u>twinkling</u>	A very short time (as the time it takes the eye to blink or the heart to beat. <i>Twinkling</i> eyes happy smiles.
<u>wink</u>	An act of winking. <i>He winked at Nicole as he passed.</i>
