Associations of "At the moment" (30 Words)

blink	Keep back by blinking. <i>Feargal would have given her all this without a blink.</i>
blinking	Used to express annoyance. <i>What a bally or blinking nuisance.</i>
brief	Instruct a barrister by brief. <i>The president made a brief working visit to Moscow.</i>
exigent	Pressing; demanding. <i>Became more exigent over his pronunciation.</i>
extempore	Without prior preparation. <i>An extempore speech.</i>
flicker	Shine unsteadily. <i>A flicker of a smile passed across her face.</i>
freshen	Make (to feel) fresh. <i>It didn't take long to freshen her make up.</i>
glance	Throw a glance at take a brief look at. <i>She only glanced at the paper.</i>
grin	Express with a broad smile. <i>A silly grin.</i>
immediate	Immediately before or after as in a chain of cause and effect. <i>Coronary thrombosis was the immediate cause of death.</i>
imminent	Close in time; about to occur. <i>In imminent danger.</i>
improvised	Created and performed spontaneously or without preparation; impromptu. <i>An improvised short speech.</i>
impulsion	A strong urge to do something. <i>Attitudes changed under the impulsion of humanitarian considerations.</i>

instant	Instant coffee. <i>We can't promise instant solutions.</i>
instantly	Urgently or persistently. <i>She fell asleep almost instantly.</i>
minute	The distance covered in a minute by someone driving or walking. <i>A minute inspection of the grounds.</i>
nadir	The point on the celestial sphere directly below an observer. <i>Asking that question was the nadir of my career.</i>
nod	Signify or express greeting assent or understanding by nodding. <i>The teacher noded when the student gave the right answer.</i>
offhand	With little or no preparation or forethought. <i>She had made these remarks offhandedly.</i>
provisory	Subject to a proviso. <i>A provisory clause.</i>
short	A short sound such as a short signal in Morse code or a short vowel or syllable. <i>The electrical circuit had shorted out.</i>
smile	Express with a smile. <i>He smiled at Shelley.</i>
sojourn	A temporary stay (e.g., as a guest). <i>Her sojourn in Rome.</i>
sparkling	(of a drink) effervescent; fizzy. <i>Sparkling snow.</i>
stopgap	Something contrived to meet an urgent need or emergency. <i>Transplants are only a stopgap until more sophisticated alternatives can work.</i>
temporarily	For a limited period of time; not permanently. <i>Symptoms may disappear temporarily.</i>
transitory	Not permanent. <i>Love is transitory but it is eternal.</i>
twinkle	(of a star or light, or a shiny object) shine with a gleam that changes constantly from bright to faint. <i>The smile made her face crease and her eyes twinkle.</i>
twinkling	A very short time (as the time it takes the eye to blink or the heart to beat). <i>Twinkling eyes happy smiles.</i>
wink	An act of winking. <i>He winked at Nicole as he passed.</i>
