## Associations of "At the moment" (30 Words)

<b>blink</b>	Keep back by blinking. <i>Feargal would have given her all this without a <b>blink</b>.</i>
<b>blinking</b>	Used to express annoyance. <i>What a bally or <b>blinking</b> nuisance.</i>
<b>brief</b>	Instruct a barrister by brief. <i>The president made a <b>brief</b> working visit to Moscow.</i>
<b>exigent</b>	Pressing; demanding. <i>Became more <b>exigent</b> over his pronunciation.</i>
<b>extempore</b>	Without prior preparation. <i>An <b>extempore</b> speech.</i>
<b>flicker</b>	Shine unsteadily. <i>A <b>flicker</b> of a smile passed across her face.</i>
<b>freshen</b>	Make (to feel) fresh. <i>It didn't take long to <b>freshen</b> her make up.</i>
<b>glance</b>	Throw a glance at take a brief look at. <i>She only <b>glanced</b> at the paper.</i>
<b>grin</b>	Express with a broad smile. <i>A silly <b>grin</b>.</i>
<b>immediate</b>	Immediately before or after as in a chain of cause and effect. <i>Coronary thrombosis was the <b>immediate</b> cause of death.</i>
<b>imminent</b>	Close in time; about to occur. <i>In <b>imminent</b> danger.</i>
<b>improvised</b>	Created and performed spontaneously or without preparation; impromptu. <i>An <b>improvised</b> short speech.</i>
<b>impulsion</b>	A strong urge to do something. <i>Attitudes changed under the <b>impulsion</b> of humanitarian considerations.</i>

<b>instant</b>	Instant coffee. <i>We can't promise <b>instant</b> solutions.</i>
<b>instantly</b>	Urgently or persistently. <i>She fell asleep almost <b>instantly</b>.</i>
<b>minute</b>	The distance covered in a minute by someone driving or walking. <i>A <b>minute</b> inspection of the grounds.</i>
<b>nadir</b>	The point on the celestial sphere directly below an observer. <i>Asking that question was the <b>nadir</b> of my career.</i>
<b>nod</b>	Signify or express greeting assent or understanding by nodding. <i>The teacher <b>noded</b> when the student gave the right answer.</i>
<b>offhand</b>	With little or no preparation or forethought. <i>She had made these remarks <b>offhandedly</b>.</i>
<b>provisory</b>	Subject to a proviso. <i>A <b>provisory</b> clause.</i>
<b>short</b>	A short sound such as a short signal in Morse code or a short vowel or syllable. <i>The electrical circuit had <b>shorted</b> out.</i>
<b>smile</b>	Express with a smile. <i>He <b>smiled</b> at Shelley.</i>
<b>sojourn</b>	A temporary stay (e.g., as a guest). <i>Her <b>sojourn</b> in Rome.</i>
<b>sparkling</b>	(of a drink) effervescent; fizzy. <i><b>Sparkling</b> snow.</i>
<b>stopgap</b>	Something contrived to meet an urgent need or emergency. <i>Transplants are only a <b>stopgap</b> until more sophisticated alternatives can work.</i>
<b>temporarily</b>	For a limited period of time; not permanently. <i>Symptoms may disappear <b>temporarily</b>.</i>
<b>transitory</b>	Not permanent. <i>Love is <b>transitory</b> but it is eternal.</i>
<b>twinkle</b>	(of a star or light, or a shiny object) shine with a gleam that changes constantly from bright to faint. <i>The smile made her face crease and her eyes <b>twinkle</b>.</i>
<b>twinkling</b>	A very short time (as the time it takes the eye to blink or the heart to beat). <i><b>Twinkling</b> eyes happy smiles.</i>
<b>wink</b>	An act of winking. <i>He <b>winked</b> at Nicole as he passed.</i>
