A building or group of buildings where goods are manufactured or assembled chiefly by machine.

*The group have become a rock and roll hit **factory**.*

foundry

A workshop or factory for casting metal.

garage

An establishment which sells fuel or which repairs and sells motor vehicles.

*A **garage** band.*

manufacturing complex

The act of making something (a product) from raw materials.

mill

Scottish philosopher who expounded Bentham's utilitarianism; father of John Stuart Mill (1773-1836).

*A steel **mill**.*

plant

A small plant as distinct from a shrub or tree.

*Inadequate investment in new **plant**.*

studio

A studio flat.

*The big names are being snapped up by major **studios** in the film capital.*

workroom

Room where work is done.

works

Everything available; usually preceded by `the.

*The reward for good **works**.*

workshop

A room or building in which goods are manufactured or repaired.

*A writers **workshop** was held on 25 27 July.*

yard

A square or cubic yard especially of sand or other building materials.

*They opened a repair **yard** on the edge of town.*



Associations of "Atelier" (30 Words)

architect

Design and configure (a program or system).

*An **architect** takes into consideration all of the constraints involved in building a house.*

<u>blueprint</u>	Make a blueprint of. <i>The landscape architect blueprinted a ten year plan for regeneration of the magnificent formal gardens.</i>
bookstore	A shop where books are sold.
<u>builder</u>	A person or thing that creates or develops a particular thing. <i>Empire builder.</i>
<u>candy</u>	Preserve (fruit, nuts, etc.) by coating and saturating it with a sugar syrup. <i>People sat eating popcorn and candy.</i>
carpentry	The activity or occupation of making or repairing things in wood. <i>Carpentry skills.</i>
<u>designer</u>	Made or designed by a famous and prestigious fashion designer. <i>A designer label.</i>
<u>emporium</u>	A large retail store selling a wide variety of goods.
<u>engineer</u>	A person qualified in a branch of engineering especially as a professional. <i>The prime engineer of the approach.</i>
<u>factory</u>	A plant consisting of one or more buildings with facilities for manufacturing. <i>A clothing factory.</i>
florist	Someone who grows and deals in flowers. <i>The florist made up an attractive bouquet.</i>
grocer	A retail merchant who sells foodstuffs (and some household supplies).
hairdresser	Someone who cuts or beautifies hair.
illustrator	A person who draws or creates pictures for magazines, books, advertising, etc.
mall	An alley used for pall mall. <i>They spent their weekends at the local malls.</i>
<u>marketplace</u>	The arena of commercial dealings. <i>They were driven from the marketplace.</i>
merchandising	The exchange of goods for an agreed sum of money. <i>The characters are still popular and found on a wide variety of merchandising.</i>
millinery	The trade or business of a milliner. <i>She is contemplating a new career in millinery.</i>
modernist	Of or associated with modernism, especially in the arts. <i>James Joyce and other 20th century modernists.</i>
muralist	A painter of murals.

painter	A line that is attached to the bow of a boat and used for tying up (as when docking or towing). <i>A self employed painter and decorator.</i>
<u>painting</u>	Creating a picture with paints. <i>Pastels require a different approach to painting.</i>
pilfer	Steal (things of little value). <i>She produced the handful of coins she had managed to pilfer.</i>
purloin	Steal (something). <i>He must have managed to purloin a copy of the key.</i>
<u>restaurant</u>	A building where people go to eat.
sculptor	A faint constellation in the southern hemisphere near Phoenix and Cetus.
shop	Visit one or more shops or websites to buy goods. <i>She pointed to the classroom ceiling I live here over the shop.</i>
stall	Cause to stall. <i>The horses were stalled at Upper Bolney Farm.</i>
<u>store</u>	A shop selling basic necessities. <i>Cupboards for medical stores.</i>
workshop	A room or building in which goods are manufactured or repaired. <i>The play was workshopped briefly at the Shaw Festival.</i>
