<b>champion</b>	Protect or fight for as a champion. <i>He became the determined <b>champion</b> of a free press.</i>
<b>classroom</b>	A room in which a class of pupils or students is taught.
<b>compete</b>	Compete for something engage in a contest measure oneself against others. <i>He <b>competed</b> with a number of other candidates.</i>
<b>competition</b>	A business relation in which two parties compete to gain customers. <i>A beauty <b>competition</b>.</i>
<b>competitor</b>	The contestant you hope to defeat. <i>Two <b>competitors</b> were banned for taking drugs.</i>
<b>contend</b>	Struggle to surmount (a difficulty). <i>He <b>contends</b> that the judge was wrong.</i>
<b>contender</b>	The contestant you hope to defeat. <i>A presidential <b>contender</b>.</i>
<b>fencing</b>	The art or sport of fighting with swords (especially the use of foils or epees or sabres to score points under a set of rules). <i>Security <b>fencing</b>.</i>
<b>fitness</b>	Fitness to traverse the seas. <i>They had to prove their <b>fitness</b> for the position.</i>
<b>gymnasium</b>	A room or building equipped for gymnastics, games, and other physical exercise.
<b>indoor</b>	Relating to sports played indoors. <i><b>Indoor</b> activities for a rainy day.</i>
<b>jogger</b>	Loose trousers made of a stretchy fabric and typically elasticated at the waist and ankles, worn especially for jogging. <i>Sporty types in <b>joggers</b>.</i>
<b>marathon</b>	Any long and arduous undertaking. <i>She s embarking on a <b>marathon</b> UK tour.</i>
<b>marathoner</b>	Someone who participates in long-distance races (especially in marathons).
<b>pugilism</b>	The profession or hobby of boxing. <i>I do not go to displays of <b>pugilism</b>.</i>
<b>pugilist</b>	Someone who fights with his fists for sport.
<b>race</b>	A series of races for horses or dogs held at a fixed time on a set course. <i>The <b>race</b> is to the swift.</i>

<b>runner</b>	A plant that spreads by means of runners. <i>A 400 metres <b>runner</b>.</i>
<b>running</b>	The act of participating in an athletic competition involving running on a track. <i>He failed to produce an essay for the third week <b>running</b>.</i>
<b>sport</b>	Someone who engages in sports. <i>It was considered great <b>sport</b> to catch him out.</i>
<b>sprint</b>	(especially in software development) a set period of time during which specific tasks must be completed. <i>Team members discuss issues with each other at the end of every <b>sprint</b>.</i>
<b>swimming</b>	The act of swimming. <i>Rachel had always loved <b>swimming</b>.</i>
<b>trainer</b>	One who trains other persons or animals. <i>Teacher <b>trainers</b>.</i>
<b>weightlifting</b>	The sport or activity of lifting barbells or other heavy weights There are two standard lifts in modern weightlifting the single movement lift from floor to extended position the snatch and the two movement lift from floor to shoulder position and from shoulders to extended position the clean and jerk.
<b>winner</b>	A gambler who wins a bet. <i>Anyone taking out a fixed rate mortgage could be on to a <b>winner</b>.</i>
