

repentance Each person who turns to God in genuine **repentance** and faith will be

saved.

repentant Feeling or expressing remorse for misdeeds.

He is truly **repentant** for his incredible naivety and stupidity.

Repentance; regret.

With **rue** my heart is laden.

A means of preserving from harm or unpleasantness.

His only **salvation** was to outfly the enemy.
