heinous (of a person or wrongful act, especially a crime) utterly odious or wicked.

hellish Of or like hell.

Hellish weather.

horrible Causing or likely to cause horror; shocking.

War is beyond all words horrible.

horrifying Provoking horror- Winston Churchill. *An alarming even horrifying* picture.

inadequateLacking the quality or quantity required; insufficient for a purpose.

An **inadequate** income.

infernal Being of the underworld.

An infernal nuisance.

inhuman Lacking human qualities of compassion and mercy; cruel and barbaric.

A babel of **inhuman** noises.

lamentable Full of or expressing sorrow or grief.

The **lamentable** friends trailing their long black garments.

Used of sounds and voices low in pitch or frequency.

Jobs with **low** status.

low-down Having the soulful feeling of early blues.

merciless Showing no mercy.

The merciless enemy.

miserable Causing unhappiness or discomfort.

His miserable treatment of his family.

Having the ugly or frightening appearance of a monster.

Repugnant to the mind.

A **nasty** vicious looking hatchet.

terrible Exceptionally bad or displeasing.

unlovely Not attractive; ugly. *Unlovely tower blocks*.

Offensive or disagreeable; causing discomfort or unhappiness.

Unpleasant to look at.

unspeakable Exceptionally bad or displeasing. *A piece of unspeakable abuse.*

unutterable Defying expression or description.

Moments of **unutterable** grief.

worst To the highest degree of inferiority or badness.
