<u>appalling</u>	Causing shock or dismay; horrific. <i>Appalling</i> conditions.
awful	Causing fear or dread or terror. I ve made an awful fool of myself.
barbaric	Without civilizing influences-Margaret Meade. Drinking undiluted wine was considered barbaric .
barbarous	(of language) coarse and unrefined. Many early child rearing practices were barbarous by modern standards.
<u>base</u>	Serving as or forming a base. The painter applied a base coat followed by two finishing coats.
black	Of a ski run of the highest level of difficulty as indicated by black markers positioned along it. <i>He discusses the position of</i> black <i>people in America.</i>
brutal	(of persons or their actions) able or disposed to inflict pain or suffering. The brutal honesty of his observations.
brutish	Resembling a beast; showing lack of human sensibility. <i>He was coarse and brutish.</i>
cruel	Causing pain or suffering. A cruel remark.
dark	Used of color having a dark hue. <i>Dark</i> curly hair.
<u>diabolical</u>	Characteristic of the Devil, or so evil as to be suggestive of the Devil. <i>His diabolical cunning.</i>
<u>dreadful</u>	Extremely disagreeable and unpleasant. Don t go out the weather is dreadful .
fiendish	Extremely awkward or complex. A fiendish despot.
flagitious	Extremely wicked, deeply criminal. A flagitious crime.
frightful	Provoking horror. There s been a most frightful accident.
<u>ghastly</u>	Deathly white. The weather was ghastly .
grievous	Of great gravity or crucial import; requiring serious thought. <i>His death was a grievous blow.</i>
<u>heinous</u>	(of a person or wrongful act, especially a crime) utterly odious or wicked. <i>Heinous</i> accusations.



<u>hellish</u>	Of or like hell. <i>Hellish</i> weather.
horrible	Causing or likely to cause horror; shocking. War is beyond all words horrible .
<u>horrifying</u>	Provoking horror- Winston Churchill. An alarming even horrifying picture.
<u>inadequate</u>	Lacking the quality or quantity required; insufficient for a purpose. An inadequate income.
infernal	Being of the underworld. An infernal nuisance.
inhuman	Lacking human qualities of compassion and mercy; cruel and barbaric. <i>A babel of inhuman noises.</i>
lamentable	Full of or expressing sorrow or grief. The lamentable friends trailing their long black garments.
low	Used of sounds and voices low in pitch or frequency. Jobs with low status.
low-down	Having the soulful feeling of early blues.
<u>merciless</u>	Showing no mercy. The merciless enemy.
<u>miserable</u>	Causing unhappiness or discomfort. His miserable treatment of his family.
monstrous	Having the ugly or frightening appearance of a monster. The monstrous tidal wave swamped the surrounding countryside.
<u>murderous</u>	Characteristic of or capable of or having a tendency toward killing another human being. <i>Murderous</i> thugs.
<u>nasty</u>	Damaging or harmful. Will he say nasty things at my funeral.
nefarious	Extremely wicked. The nefarious activities of the organized crime syndicates.
<u>painful</u>	Causing distress or trouble. Their attempts at reggae are painful .
poor	Lacking in quality or substances. The jejune diets of the very poor .
<u>ruthless</u>	Having or showing no pity or compassion for others. An act of ruthless ferocity.



savage	Cruel and vicious; aggressively hostile. A savage attack on the government.
terrible	Causing fear or dread or terror. The stranger gave a terrible smile.
<u>unpleasant</u>	(of a person or their manner) unfriendly and inconsiderate; rude. <i>Unpleasant</i> odors.
<u>unsatisfactory</u>	Not giving satisfaction. Shops should take back unsatisfactory goods.
<u>unspeakable</u>	Not able to be expressed in words. An unspeakable odor came sweeping into the room.
very bad	Precisely as stated.
vicious	Marked by deep ill will; deliberately harmful. The dog was vicious and likely to bite.
vile	Extremely unpleasant. The vile development of slavery appalled them.
villainous	Extremely bad or unpleasant. A villainous smell.
wicked	Playfully mischievous. A wicked sense of humour.
woeful	Of very poor quality or condition. The remark was enough to establish his woeful ignorance about the theatre.

<u>appalling</u>	Very bad; awful. <i>His conduct was appalling</i> .
<u>atrocity</u>	An extremely wicked or cruel act, typically one involving physical violence or injury. <i>Atrocities in cheap red nylon.</i>
awful	Awfully very. Awful worshippers with bowed heads.
beastly	In a beastly manner. Beastly desires.
disgusting	Highly offensive; arousing aversion or disgust. A disgusting smell.
<u>dreadful</u>	Exceptionally bad or displeasing. She looked quite dreadful and she was struggling for breath.
eyesore	A thing that is very ugly, especially a building. The office crumbled into an eyesore .
fearsome	Frightening, especially in appearance. The cat mewed displaying a fearsome set of teeth.
<u>frightening</u>	Making someone afraid or anxious; terrifying. A frightening experience.
frightful	Extreme in degree or extent or amount or impact. A frightful crime of decapitation.
<u>ghastly</u>	Very objectionable, bad, or unpleasant. <i>Ghastly</i> wounds.
<u>gruesome</u>	Extremely unpleasant. The most gruesome murder.
<u>hellish</u>	Very unpleasant. An unearthly hellish landscape.
hideous	Extremely ugly. A hideous scar.
horrible	Provoking horror. War is beyond all words horrible .
<u>horrific</u>	Causing horror. <i>Horrific</i> conditions in the mining industry.
<u>horrifying</u>	Provoking horror. An alarming even horrifying picture.
indescribable	Defying expression or description. Most prisoners suffered indescribable hardship.



ineffable	Too great or extreme to be expressed or described in words. <i>Ineffable</i> ecstasy.
inexpressible	(of a feeling) too strong to be described or conveyed in words. A mood of inexpressible longing.
<u>nasty</u>	Repugnant to the mind. A nasty vicious looking hatchet.
terrible	Exceptionally bad or displeasing. Despite passing my driving test first time I m a terrible driver.
unlovely	Not attractive; ugly. <i>Unlovely</i> tower blocks.
<u>unpleasant</u>	Offensive or disagreeable; causing discomfort or unhappiness. An unpleasant personality.
unsightly	Unpleasant to look at. Unsightly billboards.
<u>unspeakable</u>	Exceptionally bad or displeasing. A piece of unspeakable abuse.
unutterable	Defying expression or description. Moments of unutterable grief.
worst	To the highest degree of inferiority or badness. When I saw the ambulance outside her front door I began to fear the worst .
