- *Capable of being attained or accomplished.*
- *Able to be attained; achievable.*



Synonyms of "Attainable" as an adjective (7 Words)

- accessible** Capable of being read with comprehension.
*Most students now have computers **accessible**.*
- achievable** Able to be brought about or reached successfully.
*He broke the climb into small **achievable** stages.*
- come-at-able** Having inherent physical or mental ability or capacity.
- obtainable** Able to be obtained.
*Customers financial details are easily **obtainable**.*
- reachable** Easily approached.
*All the wires were easily **reachable**.*
- realizable** In or able to be converted into cash.
*10 per cent of **realizable** assets.*
- winnable** Able to be won or gained.
*A tough but **winnable** game.*



Usage Examples of "Attainable" as an adjective

- *An attainable target.*
- *Choose an attainable goal.*
- *Yields in excess of 6 % are easily attainable.*



Associations of "Attainable" (30 Words)

accessibility	The quality of being easily reached, entered, or used by people who have a disability. <i>Students were concerned about the accessibility of quality academic counselling.</i>
accessible	Capable of being read with comprehension. <i>Readily accessible to the nonprofessional reader.</i>
acquire	Learn or develop (a skill, habit, or quality). <i>He acquired a reputation for scrupulous honesty.</i>
acquired	Gotten through environmental forces. <i>Acquired characteristics such as a suntan or a broken nose cannot be passed on.</i>
acquisition	The action of acquiring something. <i>The acquisition of self control.</i>
admission	A purchase of one company by another. <i>Western culture places a high value on material admission.</i>
admission	The fee charged for admission. <i>The surgery was performed on his second admission to the clinic.</i>
available	Able to be used or obtained; at someone's disposal. <i>He was not available for comment.</i>
conveniently	In a way that fits well with particular needs, activities, and plans. <i>This house is very conveniently located.</i>
earn	Earn on some commercial or business transaction earn as salary or wages. <i>This latest win earned them 50 000 in prize money.</i>
gain	Benefit. <i>Nothing would be gained by talking about it.</i>
get	Take vengeance on or get even. <i>I ll get mine you ll get yours we ll all get wealthy.</i>
glean	Gather (leftover grain) after a harvest. <i>The conditions of farm workers in the 1890s made gleaning essential.</i>
have	Have sex with archaic use. <i>Have a postdoc.</i>
incur	Become subject to (something unwelcome or unpleasant) as a result of one's own behaviour or actions. <i>People who smoke incur a great danger to their health.</i>

obtain	Receive a specified treatment (abstract). <i>The price of silver fell to that obtaining elsewhere in the ancient world.</i>
obtainable	Able to be obtained. <i>Customers financial details are easily obtainable.</i>
own	Have something as one's own possess. <i>A state owned company.</i>
procure	Obtain (someone) as a prostitute for another person. <i>Food procured for the rebels.</i>
procurement	The action of obtaining or procuring something. <i>Financial assistance for the procurement of legal advice.</i>
reap	Receive (something, especially something beneficial) as a consequence of one's own or another's actions. <i>Farmers agreed to continue reaping the land by traditional means.</i>
regain	Reach (a place, position, or thing) again; get back to. <i>They were unable to regain their boats.</i>
secure	Succeed in obtaining (something), especially with difficulty. <i>A more competitive economy will lead to an increase in secure employment.</i>
separately	As a separate entity or entities; not together. <i>They arrived together but left separately.</i>
singly	One at a time; separately or individually. <i>He talked to the players singly and in groups.</i>
unavailable	Not available or accessible or at hand. <i>His secretary said he was unavailable for comment.</i>
uninjured	Not injured physically or mentally. <i>They escaped uninjured when their homes were hit.</i>
usable	Convenient for use or disposal. <i>Usable information.</i>
usefulness	The quality or fact of being useful. <i>Faults that affect the book's usefulness.</i>
wangle	Achieve something by means of trickery or devious methods. <i>I think we should be able to wangle it so that you can start tomorrow.</i>
