<b>consummation</b>	The act of consuming something. <i>The eager <b>consummation</b> that follows a long and passionate seduction.</i>
<b>effecting</b>	An outward appearance.
<b>fulfilment</b>	The achievement of something desired, promised, or predicted. <i>Winning the championship was the <b>fulfilment</b> of a childhood dream.</i>
<a href="#"><u>mastery</u></a>	Power to dominate or defeat. <i>A child s <b>mastery</b> of language.</i>
<b>proficiency</b>	Skillfulness in the command of fundamentals deriving from practice and familiarity. <i>He demonstrated his <b>proficiency</b> in Chinese.</i>
<b>qualification</b>	The qualification stage of a sporting event. <i>The five year residency <b>qualification</b> for presidential candidates.</i>
<b>realization</b>	The achievement of something desired or anticipated. <i>A growing <b>realization</b> of the need to create common economic structures.</i>
<b>skill</b>	The ability to do something well; expertise. <i>Difficult work taking great <b>skill</b>.</i>

<b>constellation</b>	A group of stars forming a recognizable pattern that is traditionally named after its apparent form or identified with a mythological figure. <i>No two patients ever show exactly the same <b>constellation</b> of symptoms.</i>
<b>exploit</b>	Work excessively hard. <i>The company was <b>exploiting</b> a legal loophole.</i>
<b>feat</b>	A notable achievement. <i>The new printing presses were considerable <b>feats</b> of engineering.</i>
<b>gain</b>	Increase (one's body weight). <i>The home team was <b>gaining</b> ground.</i>
<b>honored</b>	Having an illustrious reputation; respected.
<b>jubilation</b>	The utterance of sounds expressing great joy. <i>Unbelievable scenes of <b>jubilation</b>.</i>
<b>meritorious</b>	(of an action or claim) likely to succeed on the merits of the case. <i>The costs involved in civil litigation may prevent a <b>meritorious</b> appeal.</i>
<b>monumental</b>	Of outstanding significance. <i>It s been a <b>monumental</b> effort.</i>
<b>notable</b>	Widely known and esteemed. <i>The gardens are <b>notable</b> for their collection of magnolias and camellias.</i>
<b>outshine</b>	Attract more attention and praise than others. <i>It is a shame when a mother <b>outshines</b> a daughter.</i>
<b>payoff</b>	Payment made to a person in a position of trust to corrupt his judgment.
<b>prestigious</b>	Having an illustrious reputation; respected. <i>A <b>prestigious</b> academic post.</i>
<b>purchase</b>	Obtain by purchase acquire by means of a financial transaction. <i>The victory was <b>purchased</b> by the death of Rhiwallon.</i>
