percipient Characterized by ease and quickness in perceiving.

He is a **percipient** interpreter of the public mood.

solicitous Eager or anxious to do something.

Solicitous parents.

Of characters in literature or drama evoking empathic or sympathetic

She was **sympathetic** towards staff with family problems.

tender Young and immature.

Pelargoniums are colourful but **tender** plants.

thoughtful Taking heed giving close and thoughtful attention.

An understanding friend.


vigilant Keeping careful watch for possible danger or difficulties.

mindful Inclined or willing to do something.

observant Quick to notice or perceive things.

precaution etc.

Acting with or showing care and thought for the future.

Prudent rulers.
