<a href="#">act</a>	Take action do something. <i>The breaks of my new car <b>act</b> quickly.</i>
<a href="#">apathy</a>	The trait of lacking enthusiasm for or interest in things generally. <i>Widespread <b>apathy</b> among students.</i>
<a href="#">bearing</a>	Characteristic way of bearing one's body. <i>The Point is on a <b>bearing</b> of 015.</i>
<a href="#">behaviour</a>	The way in which one acts or conducts oneself, especially towards others. <i>The erratic <b>behaviour</b> of the old car.</i>
<a href="#">bravado</a>	A bold manner or a show of boldness intended to impress or intimidate. <i>He possesses none of the classic wheeler dealer's casual <b>bravado</b>.</i>
<a href="#">comport</a>	Conduct oneself; behave. <i>They do all that nature and art can do to <b>comport</b> with his will.</i>
<a href="#">conduct</a>	Transmit a form of energy such as heat or electricity by conduction. <i>The concert is to be <b>conducted</b> by Sir Simon Rattle.</i>
<a href="#">demeanor</a>	The way a person behaves toward other people.
<a href="#">disinclination</a>	A reluctance or lack of enthusiasm. <i>Lucy felt a strong <b>disinclination</b> to talk about her engagement.</i>
<a href="#">disinterest</a>	Lack of interest in something. <i>I do not claim any scholarly <b>disinterest</b> with this book.</i>
<a href="#">dispassionate</a>	Not influenced by strong emotion, and so able to be rational and impartial. <i>She dealt with life's disasters in a calm <b>dispassionate</b> way.</i>
<a href="#">equity</a>	The quality of being fair and impartial. <i><b>Equity</b> of treatment.</i>
<a href="#">ethology</a>	The study of human behaviour and social organization from a biological perspective.
<a href="#">hesitant</a>	Tentative, unsure, or slow in acting or speaking. <i>Clients are <b>hesitant</b> about buying.</i>

<b>hesitatingly</b>	With hesitation; in a hesitant manner.
<b>impartiality</b>	Equal treatment of all rivals or disputants; fairness. <i>Entries had to be submitted under a pseudonym to ensure <b>impartiality</b> in the judging process.</i>
<b><u>inconsiderate</u></b>	Lacking regard for the rights or feelings of others. <i>Shockingly <b>inconsiderate</b> behavior.</i>
<b><u>indecisive</u></b>	(of a person) not able to make decisions quickly and effectively. <i>He was too <b>indecisive</b> to carry out his political programme.</i>
<b>neutrality</b>	Nonparticipation in a dispute or war. <i>The structure has overall electrical <b>neutrality</b>.</i>
<b>nonchalance</b>	The trait of remaining calm and seeming not to care; a casual lack of concern. <i>An air of <b>nonchalance</b>.</i>
<b>noncommittal</b>	Refusing to bind oneself to a particular course of action or view or the like. <i>Her boyfriend was <b>noncommittal</b> about their future together.</i>
<b><u>objectivity</u></b>	Judgment based on observable phenomena and uninfluenced by emotions or personal prejudices. <i>The piece lacked any <b>objectivity</b>.</i>
<b>pretension</b>	A claim or assertion of a claim to something. <i>His <b>pretensions</b> to the imperial inheritance.</i>
<b>rationalism</b>	The doctrine that reason is the right basis for regulating conduct. <i>Scientific <b>rationalism</b>.</i>
<b><u>reluctance</u></b>	The property of a magnetic circuit of opposing the passage of magnetic flux lines, equal to the ratio of the magnetomotive force to the magnetic flux. <i>She sensed his <b>reluctance</b> to continue.</i>
<b>reluctant</b>	Unwillingness to do something contrary to your custom. <i>Fresh from college and <b>reluctant</b> for the moment to marry him.</i>
<b>reluctantly</b>	With reluctance. <i>He <b>reluctantly</b> agrees to do his duty.</i>
<b>swagger</b>	Walk or behave in a very confident and arrogant or self-important way. <i>I ll take you somewhere <b>swagger</b>.</i>
<b>unconcern</b>	A lack of worry or interest, especially when surprising or callous. <i>He is famed for his laid back attitude his apparent <b>unconcern</b> about his actions.</i>
<b><u>unwillingly</u></b>	Against one's wishes; reluctantly. <i>Anya finds herself thrust <b>unwillingly</b> into the spotlight.</i>
