hesitant Tentative, unsure, or slow in acting or speaking.

**hesitatingly** With hesitation; in a hesitant manner.

Equal treatment of all rivals or disputants; fairness.

**impartiality** Entries had to be submitted under a pseudonym to ensure **impartiality** in

the judging process.

inconsiderate Lacking regard for the rights or feelings of others.

**neutrality**Nonparticipation in a dispute or war.
