Definitions of "Attractiveness" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “attractiveness” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *The quality of being pleasing or appealing to the senses.*
- *(in a person) the quality of being appealing or sexually alluring to look at.*
- *Sexual allure.*
- *The quality of arousing interest; being attractive or something that attracts.*
- *The possession of qualities or features that arouse interest.*



Synonyms of "Attractiveness" as a noun (1 Word)

attraction A characteristic that provides pleasure and attracts.
*She has very romantic ideas about sexual **attraction**.*

- *My aunt did not marry until late in life in spite of her attractiveness.*
- *This scheme could enhance the attractiveness of the area.*
- *Simply smiling can increase your attractiveness to others.*
- *The new agreements will enhance the city's attractiveness to overseas investors.*

- allure** The power to entice or attract through personal charm.
*Will sponsors really be **allured** by such opportunities.*
- alluring** Highly attractive and able to arouse hope or desire.
*The town offers **alluring** shops and restaurants.*
- appealing** Able to attract interest or draw favorable attention.
*An **appealing** look.*

| <u>entrance</u> | An act or instance of entering somewhere. <i>They waited at the entrance to the garden.</i> |
| <u>entrancing</u> | Capturing interest as if by a spell. <i>An entrancing smile.</i> |
| <u>fascinating</u> | Capturing interest as if by a spell. <i>A fascinating woman.</i> |
| glamorize | Interpret romantically. <i>The lyrics glamorize drugs.</i> |
| glamorous | Attractive or appealing in an exotic or exciting way. <i>I really wanted the glamorous job of a flight attendant.</i> |
| interesting | Arousing curiosity or interest; holding or catching the attention. <i>It will be very interesting to see what they come up with.</i> |
| intriguing | Disturbingly provocative. <i>The food is an intriguing combination of German and French.</i> |
| <u>inviting</u> | Offering the promise of an attractive or enjoyable experience. <i>The sea down there looks so inviting.</i> |
| <u>irresistible</u> | Too attractive and tempting to be resisted. <i>What happens when an irresistible force meets an immovable object.</i> |

- pleasing** Pleasant or agreeable to the senses.
*A **pleasing** piece of news.*
- salient** Represented as leaping (rampant but leaning forward).
*The **salient** object in my view.*
- seductive** Tending to entice into a desired action or state.
*A **seductive** voice.*
- tempting** Very pleasantly inviting.
*A **tempting** invitation.*
- winsome** Attractive or appealing in a fresh, innocent way.
*A **winsome** smile.*
