<b>account</b>	A short account of the news. <i>Her visit could not be <b>accounted</b> a success.</i>
<a href="#">alibi</a>	Exonerate by means of an alibi. <i>Her friend agreed to <b>alibi</b> her.</i>
<b>apology</b>	A poor example. <i>We were shown into an <b>apology</b> for a bedroom.</i>
<b>bank</b>	A building in which the business of banking transacted. <i>She <b>banked</b> up the fire.</i>
<b>cause</b>	Cause to do cause to act in a specified manner. <i>Forty five <b>causes</b> were entered in the list for the March session.</i>
<b>compensation</b>	The action or process of awarding compensation. <i>The grey streets of London were small <b>compensation</b> for the loss of her beloved Africa.</i>
<b>condone</b>	Excuse, overlook, or make allowances for; be lenient with. <i>She <b>condoned</b> her husband s occasional infidelities.</i>
<b>debit</b>	Enter as debit. <i>A double entry system of bookkeeping where each <b>debit</b> has a corresponding credit entry.</i>
<a href="#">default</a>	Declare a party to have defaulted and give judgement against that party. <i>The dealer could repossess the goods if the customer <b>defaulted</b>.</i>
<b>due</b>	A payment that is due e g as the price of membership. <i>The cancellation of the concert was <b>due</b> to the rain.</i>
<a href="#">excuse</a>	Accept an excuse for. <i>I had to <b>excuse</b> myself and go out of the room.</i>
<b>expire</b>	(of a document, authorization, or agreement) come to the end of the period of validity. <i>My passports <b>expired</b> last month.</i>

<b>explicate</b>	Analyse (a literary work) in order to reveal its meaning. <i>An attempt to <b>explicate</b> the relationship between crime and economic forces.</i>
<b>guise</b>	An artful or simulated semblance. <i>Sums paid under the <b>guise</b> of consultancy fees.</i>
<b>justification</b>	The action of declaring or making righteous in the sight of God. <i>The <b>justification</b> of revolutionary action.</i>
<b>justify</b>	Be a good reason for. <i>In most European languages you <b>justify</b> text by adding space between letters and words.</i>
<b>moratorium</b>	A legal authorization to debtors to postpone payment. <i>The debt was to be subject to a five year <b>moratorium</b>.</i>
<b>palliation</b>	To act in such a way as to cause an offense to seem less serious.
<b>pardon</b>	Grant a pardon to. <i>He was <b>pardoned</b> for his treason.</i>
<b>payable</b>	Debts owed by a business; liabilities. <i>It costs just 195 <b>payable</b> in five monthly instalments.</i>
<b>pretense</b>	Pretending with intention to deceive.
<b>pretext</b>	An artful or simulated semblance. <i>The rebels had the perfect <b>pretext</b> for making their move.</i>
<b>prevarication</b>	A statement that deviates from or perverts the truth.
<b>rationalization</b>	The action of making a company, process, or industry more efficient, especially by dispensing with superfluous personnel or equipment. <i>The <b>rationalization</b> of accounting standards.</i>
<b>rationalize</b>	Reorganize (a process or system) so as to make it more logical and consistent. <i>She couldn't <b>rationalize</b> her urge to return to the cottage.</i>
<b>reason</b>	Present reasons and arguments. <i>Humans do not <b>reason</b> entirely from facts.</i>
<b>receivable</b>	Awaiting payment. <i>Accounts <b>receivable</b>.</i>
<b>repayment</b>	The action of paying back a loan. <i>Minimum monthly <b>repayments</b>.</i>
<b>taxable</b>	Liable to be taxed; subject to tax. <i><b>Taxable</b> employee benefits.</i>
