### Definitions of "Atypical" as an adjective

- *Not representative of a type, group, or class.*
- *Deviating from normal expectations; somewhat odd, strange, or abnormal.*
- *Not representative of a group, class, or type.*



## Synonyms of "Atypical" as an adjective (12 Words)

<b><a href="#">aberrant</a></b>	Departing from an accepted standard. <b><i>Aberrant</i></b> chromosomes.
<b>abnormal</b>	Not normal; not typical or usual or regular or conforming to a norm. <b><i>Abnormal</i></b> powers of concentration.
<b>anomalous</b>	Deviating from the general or common order or type. <i>Sentences which are grammatically <b>anomalous</b>.</i>
<b>atypic</b>	Not representative of a group, class, or type. <i>A class of <b>atypic</b> mosses.</i>
<b>deviant</b>	Markedly different from an accepted norm. <b><i>Deviant</i></b> ideas.
<b>divergent</b>	Tending to be different or develop in different directions. <i>Varieties of English can remain astonishingly <b>divergent</b> from one another.</i>



<b>irregular</b>	Failing to meet a standard of manufacture due to an imperfection. <i><b>Irregular</b> hiring practices.</i>
<b>uncommon</b>	Marked by an uncommon quality especially superlative or extreme of its kind. <i>Frost and floods are <b>uncommon</b> during these months.</i>
<b>unconventional</b>	Not conforming to accepted rules or standards. <i>His <b>unconventional</b> approach to life.</i>
<b>unorthodox</b>	Breaking with convention or tradition. <i>An <b>unorthodox</b> lifestyle.</i>
<b>untypical</b>	Not representative of a group, class, or type. <i>He considers the film <b>untypical</b> of college movies.</i>
<b>unusual</b>	Not habitually or commonly occurring or done. <i>It was <b>unusual</b> for Dennis to be late.</i>



## Usage Examples of "Atypical" as an adjective

- *Atypical behavior is not the accepted type of response that we expect from children.*

- *Atypical clinical findings.*
- *These days large families are atypical.*
- *Atypical pneumonia.*
- *There were somewhat atypical results in May and November.*

- abnormal** Not normal; not typical or usual or regular or conforming to a norm.  
*Participants with **abnormal** results were invited to undergo further diagnostic testing.*
- anomalous** Deviating from the general or common order or type.  
*Advanced forms of life may be **anomalous** in the universe.*

<b>arrhythmic</b>	Not rhythmic; without rhythm or regularity. <i>The <b>arrhythmic</b> phrasing of the music.</i>
<b>astigmatism</b>	(ophthalmology) impaired eyesight resulting usually from irregular conformation of the cornea; common in nearsighted people.
<b>asymmetric</b>	Characterized by asymmetry in the spatial arrangement or placement of parts or components.
<b>asymmetrical</b>	Having parts that fail to correspond to one another in shape, size, or arrangement; lacking symmetry. <i>The <b>asymmetrical</b> relationship between a landlord and a tenant.</i>
<b>asymmetry</b>	A lack of symmetry. <i>The global system is marked by great <b>asymmetry</b> the most important goods are controlled by groups in a relatively small number of countries.</i>
<b><u>erratic</u></b>	Likely to perform unpredictably. <i>Her breathing was <b>erratic</b>.</i>
<b><u>imbalance</u></b>	A lack of balance or state of disequilibrium. <i>The condition is caused by a hormonal <b>imbalance</b>.</i>
<b><u>imperfect</u></b>	The imperfect tense. <i>An <b>imperfect</b> grasp of English.</i>
<b><u>infrequent</u></b>	Not frequent; not occurring regularly or at short intervals. <i><b>Infrequent</b> outbursts of temper.</i>
<b><u>intermittent</u></b>	Stopping and starting at irregular intervals. <i><b>Intermittent</b> rain.</i>
<b><u>irregular</u></b>	A member of an irregular armed force that fights a stronger force by sabotage and harassment. <i>An <b>irregular</b> worker.</i>
<b>irregularity</b>	The state or quality of being irregular. <i>There is evidence that fraud and <b>irregularity</b> continue on a large scale.</i>
<b>myopia</b>	The quality of being short-sighted. <i>The company's corporate <b>myopia</b>.</i>
<b>myopic</b>	Unable to see distant objects clearly. <i><b>Myopic</b> thinking.</i>
<b>occasional</b>	Occurring or appearing at usually irregular intervals. <i>The <b>occasional</b> car went by but no taxis.</i>
<b>patchy</b>	Irregular or uneven in quality, texture, etc. <i>My knowledge of Egyptology is <b>patchy</b>.</i>



<b>rare</b>	Marked by an uncommon quality; especially superlative or extreme of its kind-J.R.Lowell. <i>Rare patches of green in the desert.</i>
<b>rugged</b>	(of ground or terrain) having a broken, rocky, and uneven surface. <i>A rugged competitive examination.</i>
<b>sinuate</b>	Having a wavy or sinuous margin; with alternate rounded notches and lobes.
<b>sometimes</b>	On certain occasions or in certain cases but not always. <i>Sometimes I want to do things on my own.</i>
<b>sporadic</b>	Occurring at irregular intervals or only in a few places; scattered or isolated. <i>Sporadic fighting broke out.</i>
<b>spotty</b>	Lacking consistency. <i>A spotty purple flower.</i>
<b>uncommon</b>	Marked by an uncommon quality especially superlative or extreme of its kind. <i>Prostate cancer is not uncommon in men over 60.</i>
<b>uneven</b>	Lacking consistency. <i>The uneven distribution of resources.</i>
<b>unnatural</b>	Contrary to the ordinary course of nature; abnormal. <i>The formal tone of the programmes caused them to sound stilted and unnatural.</i>
<b>unpredictable</b>	Not capable of being foretold. <i>The unpredictable weather of the Scottish islands.</i>
<b>unsteady</b>	Not regular in pitch or rhythm. <i>Nathan pushed the mug into her unsteady hand.</i>
<b>unusual</b>	Remarkable or interesting because different from or better than others. <i>An unusual meteorite.</i>
