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## Associations of "Audibly" (30 Words)

<b>acoustic</b>	Of or relating to the science of acoustics. <i>Old fashioned <b>acoustic</b> instruments.</i>
<b>audience</b>	A gathering of spectators or listeners at a (usually public) performance. <i>He requested an <b>audience</b> with the king.</i>
<b>audio</b>	Sound, especially when recorded, transmitted, or reproduced. <i><b>Audio</b> equipment.</i>
<b>auditory</b>	Of or relating to the process of hearing. <i>Teaching methods use both visual and <b>auditory</b> stimulation.</i>
<b>deaf</b>	Make or render deaf. <i><b>Deaf</b> to her warnings.</i>
<b>decibel</b>	A unit used to measure the intensity of a sound or the power level of an electrical signal by comparing it with a given level on a logarithmic scale. <i>His voice went up several <b>decibels</b>.</i>
<b>earshot</b>	The range or distance over which one can hear or be heard. <i>She waited until he was out of <b>earshot</b> before continuing.</i>
<b>echo</b>	Ring or echo with sound. <i>His words <b>echoed</b> John F Kennedy.</i>
<b>gramophone</b>	An antique record player; the sound of the vibrating needle is amplified acoustically.
<b>hear</b>	Examine or hear evidence or a case by judicial process. <i>An all woman jury <b>heard</b> the case.</i>
<b>hearing</b>	The act of hearing attentively. <i>She had moved out of <b>hearing</b>.</i>
<b>intercept</b>	An act or instance of intercepting something. <i>I <b>intercepted</b> Edward on his way to work.</i>
<b>listen</b>	Listen and pay attention. <i>Policymakers should <b>listen</b> to popular opinion.</i>

<b>listening</b>	The act of hearing attentively. <i>You can learn a lot by just <b>listening</b>.</i>
<b>musical</b>	Relating to music. <i>A <b>musical</b> comedy.</i>
<b>mute</b>	Muffle the sound of a musical instrument especially by the use of a mute. <i>His professional contentment was <b>muted</b> by personal sadness.</i>
<b>noise</b>	Emit a noise. <i>The enhancer can improve the video signal quality reducing <b>noise</b> and increasing image sharpness.</i>
<b>phonetic</b>	Relating to phonetics. <i>Detailed <b>phonetic</b> information.</i>
<b>phonetics</b>	The branch of acoustics concerned with speech processes including its production and perception and acoustic analysis. <i>A <b>phonetics</b> laboratory.</i>
<b>phonic</b>	Relating to phonics. <i>The devices of poetry foreground <b>phonic</b> elements that are usually ignored in practical speech.</i>
<b>phonology</b>	The branch of linguistics that deals with systems of sounds (including or excluding phonetics), within a language or between different languages.
<b>recorder</b>	An apparatus for recording sound, pictures, or data. <i>A <b>recorder</b> of rural life.</i>
<b>resound</b>	(of a place) be filled or echo with a sound or sounds. <i>The office <b>resounds</b> with the metronomic clicking of keyboards.</i>
<b>reverberate</b>	Be reflected as heat, sound, or light or shock waves. <i>Her deep booming laugh <b>reverberated</b> around the room.</i>
<b>reverberation</b>	The repetition of a sound resulting from reflection of the sound waves. <i><b>Reverberations</b> of the market crash were felt years later.</i>
<b>ring</b>	Ring or echo with sound. <i>Dark shadows <b>ringed</b> his eyes.</i>
<b>sonic</b>	Denoting, relating to, or of the nature of sound or sound waves. <i>A <b>sonic</b> wave.</i>
<b>speaking</b>	Capable of or involving speech or speaking. <i>Public <b>speaking</b>.</i>
<b>squeaking</b>	Having or making a high-pitched sound such as that made by a mouse or a rusty hinge.
<b>voice</b>	The melody carried by a particular voice or instrument in polyphonic music. <i>She had strained and falsified her literary <b>voice</b>.</i>
