Audio as a Noun

Definitions of "Audio" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “audio” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *Sound, especially when recorded, transmitted, or reproduced.*
- *An audible acoustic wave frequency.*
- *The audible part of a transmitted signal.*
- *The sound elements of television.*
- *A recording of acoustic signals.*



Synonyms of "Audio" as a noun (4 Words)

audio frequency The audible part of a transmitted signal.

audio recording A recording of acoustic signals.

sound Music speech and sound effects when recorded and used to accompany a film video or broadcast.

A **sound** studio.

sound recording The particular auditory effect produced by a given cause.



Usage Examples of "Audio" as a noun

- *Audio equipment.*
- *The machine can retrieve and play audio from a CD-ROM.*
- *They always raise the audio for commercials.*



Associations of "Audio" (30 Words)

acoustics	The study of the physical properties of sound.
<u>audible</u>	<p>A change of playing tactics called by the quarterback at the line of scrimmage.</p> <p><i>He saw two safeties sneaking up and called an audible.</i></p>
brassy	<p>Tastelessly showy or loud in appearance or manner (typically used of a woman).</p> <p><i>Her brassy audacious exterior.</i></p>
camcorder	A portable television camera and videocassette recorder.
cassette	A sealed plastic unit containing a length of audio tape, videotape, film, etc. wound on a pair of spools, for insertion into a recorder, playback device, or other machine.
<u>click</u>	<p>Click repeatedly or uncontrollably.</p> <p><i>You can click on an underlined word to jump to another section.</i></p>

commentary	A descriptive spoken account (especially on a broadcast) of an event or performance as it happens. <i>A biting social commentary about the divide between rich and poor.</i>
dubbing	A new soundtrack that is added to a film.
gramophone	An antique record player; the sound of the vibrating needle is amplified acoustically.
<u>hear</u>	Examine or hear evidence or a case by judicial process. <i>She just doesn't hear what I'm telling her.</i>
hoarse	Deep and harsh sounding as if from shouting or illness or emotion- Virgil Thomson. <i>Hoarse cries.</i>
homophonic	Characterized by the movement of accompanying parts in the same rhythm as the melody.
<u>monotone</u>	A single tone repeated with different words or different rhythms (especially in rendering liturgical texts). <i>His monotone reading of the two hour report.</i>
<u>noisy</u>	Stridently seeking to attract attention to one's views. <i>A noisy cafeteria.</i>
playback	A pre-recorded musical soundtrack mimed to by an actor. <i>High quality video playback.</i>
recorder	A person who keeps records. <i>A cockpit voice recorder.</i>
<u>recording</u>	The action or process of recording sound or a performance for subsequent reproduction or broadcast. <i>A recording studio.</i>
sonic	(of speed) having or caused by speed approximately equal to that of sound in air at sea level. <i>A sonic wave.</i>
sonorous	Full and loud and deep. <i>A herald chosen for his sonorous voice.</i>
squeaking	Having or making a high-pitched sound such as that made by a mouse or a rusty hinge.
<u>studio</u>	A studio flat. <i>A studio executive.</i>
subtitle	Provide a published work or article with a subtitle. <i>Films in foreign languages with English subtitles.</i>

tape

Record sound or pictures on audio or video tape or by digital means.

*He took along a dozen **tapes** to record the interview.*

tonal

Having tonality i.e. tones and chords organized in relation to one tone such as a keynote or tonic.

*Chinese is a **tonal** language.*

transcription

An arrangement of a piece of music for a different instrument, voice, or group of these.

*A **transcription** for voice and lute.*

transistor

A portable radio using circuits containing transistors rather than valves.

vcr

A magnetic tape recorder for recording (and playing back) TV programs.

video

A video recorder.

*A blank **video**.*

vocalization

The action or process of changing a consonant to a semivowel or vowel.

*A majority of people who want to sing are not aware of basic breathing and **vocalization**.*

whispering

Making a low continuous indistinct sound.
