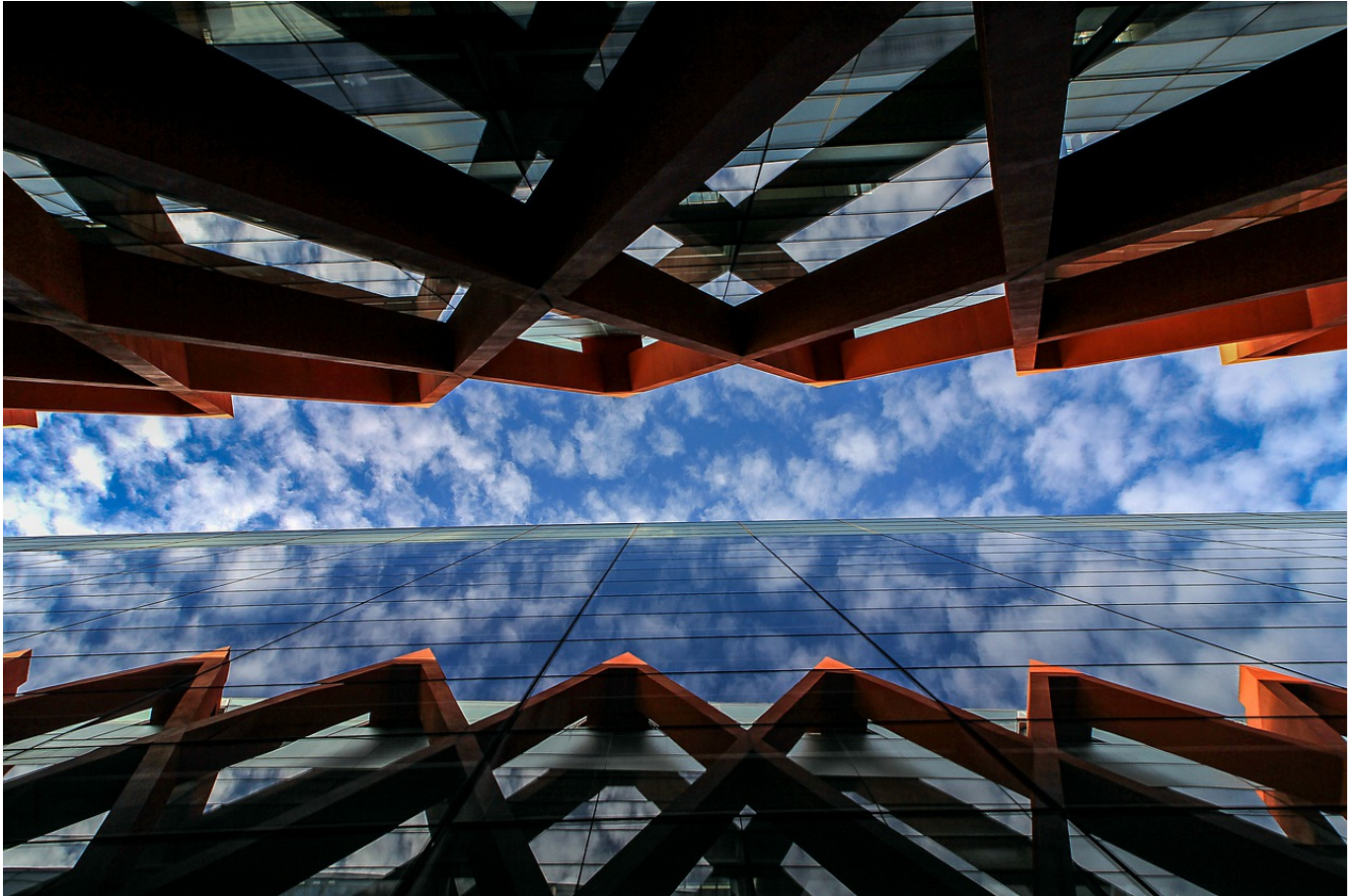

review	A subsequent examination of a patient for the purpose of monitoring earlier treatment. <i>She released her debut solo album to rave reviews.</i>
scrutiny	The act of examining something closely (as for mistakes). <i>Every aspect of local government was placed under scrutiny.</i>
study	A thing that is or deserves to be investigated the subject of an individual's study. <i>Anthropology is the study of human beings.</i>
<u>survey</u>	An act of surveying an area of land. <i>The flight involved a detailed aerial survey of military bases.</i>
<u>vetting</u>	The process of investigating someone thoroughly, especially in order to ensure that they are suitable for a job requiring secrecy, loyalty, or trustworthiness. <i>The vetting of people who work with children.</i>
