<u>hall</u>	A college or university building containing living quarters for students. <i>Halls of learning.</i>
large public room	A garment size for a large person.
meeting room	A place where things merge or flow together (especially rivers).
theatre	An operating theatre. <i>He was working on theatre defence missiles.</i>

- *The National Indoor Arena is a magnificent auditorium and one of Britain's premier indoor venues.*
- *The stage was small and the auditorium had only 366 seats.*

- astride** With the legs stretched far apart.
*He stood legs **astride**.*
- athlete** A person who is proficient in sports and other forms of physical exercise.
*He had the broad shouldered build of a natural **athlete**.*
- bench** The politicians occupying a specified bench in Parliament.
***Bench** the poodles at the dog show.*
- cafeteria** A restaurant in which customers serve themselves from a counter and pay before eating.
*Employers who offer **cafeteria** plans and other flexible programs.*

chair	The person in charge of a meeting or of an organization used as a neutral alternative to chairman or chairwoman. <i>She chaired the department for many years.</i>
classroom	A room in a school where lessons take place.
couch	Treat (a cataract) by pushing the lens of the eye downwards and backwards, out of line with the pupil. <i>There were few problems of double vision in patients who had been couched for cataracts.</i>
crouch	A crouching stance or posture. <i>He crouched down.</i>
cushion	Soften the effect of an impact on. <i>Cushion the blow.</i>
dine	Eat dinner in a restaurant. <i>He has been able to dine out on that story for the last 26 years.</i>
dining	The act of eating dinner. <i>The city has become a capital of fine dining.</i>
fitness	Fitness to traverse the seas. <i>They had to prove their fitness for the position.</i>
flop	With a flopping sound. <i>This computer can perform a million flops per second.</i>
gym	A gymnasium. <i>I can't do gym today.</i>
gymnasium	A school in Germany, Scandinavia, or central Europe that prepares pupils for university entrance.
idly	With no particular purpose, reason, or foundation. <i>This is what I always imagined myself doing in the south of France sitting idly drinking coffee watching the people.</i>
incubate	Be developing an infectious disease before symptoms appear. <i>The BSE bug incubates for around three years.</i>
indoor	Relating to sports played indoors. <i>Indoor activities for a rainy day.</i>
park	A lot where cars are parked. <i>They put the car in park and got out.</i>
proscenium	The wall that separates the stage from the auditorium in a modern theater.
recliner	A chair with a reclining back, especially one with an integral footrest.
seat	Place in or on a seat. <i>The mother seated the toddler on the high chair.</i>

- sit** Work or act as a baby sitter.
*You can **sit** wherever you like.*
- sofa** A long upholstered seat with a back and arms, for two or more people.
***Sofa** cushions.*
- squat** In gymnastics an exercise involving a squatting movement or action.
*This **squat** cost the ratepayer 46 000.*
- stool** Grow shoots in the form of stools or tillers.
*Fibre in the child s diet will soften the **stools**.*
- table** Flat tableland with steep edges.
*It was a sturdy **table**.*
- tensile** Capable of being drawn out or stretched.
*A **tensile** steel rod.*
- terrace** Make into terraces as for cultivation.
*Breakfast is served on the **terrace**.*
- theater** The art of writing and producing plays.
*He served in the Vietnam **theater** for three years.*
