### Definitions of "Aura" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “aura” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A warning sensation experienced before an attack of epilepsy or migraine.*
- *Any invisible emanation, especially an odour.*
- *(in spiritualism and some forms of alternative medicine) a supposed emanation surrounding the body of a living creature and regarded as an essential part of the individual.*
- *The distinctive atmosphere or quality that seems to surround and be generated by a person, thing, or place.*
- *An indication of radiant light drawn around the head of a saint.*
- *A sensation (as of a cold breeze or bright light) that precedes the onset of certain disorders such as a migraine attack or epileptic seizure.*
- *A distinctive but intangible quality surrounding a person or thing.*

<b>air</b>	Air regarded as necessary for breathing. <i>The <b>air</b> was stale.</i>
<b><u>ambience</u></b>	A particular environment or surrounding influence. <i>The relaxed <b>ambience</b> of the cocktail lounge is popular with guests.</i>
<b>aspect</b>	The beginning or duration or completion or repetition of the action of a verb. <i>A greenhouse with a southern <b>aspect</b>.</i>
<b>atmosphere</b>	The mass of air surrounding the Earth. <i>These beetles breed best in a damp <b>atmosphere</b>.</i>
<b>aureole</b>	The outermost region of the sun's atmosphere; visible as a white halo during a solar eclipse. <i>Her hair framed her face in a golden <b>aureole</b>.</i>
<b>character</b>	A characteristic especially one that assists in the identification of a species. <i>The Greek alphabet has 24 <b>characters</b>.</i>
<b><u>climate</u></b>	A region with a particular climate. <i>Our cold wet <b>climate</b>.</i>

<b>colour</b>	A badge cap or other item in the distinctive colours of a particular school awarded to a pupil selected to represent the school in a sport. <i>A town full of <b>colour</b> and character.</i>
<b>colouring</b>	Appearance with regard to colour. <i>The salon concentrates purely on <b>colouring</b>.</i>
<b>complexion</b>	Texture and appearance of the skin of the face. <i>A liberal political <b>complexion</b>.</i>
<b>emanation</b>	The origination of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. <i>She saw the insults as <b>emanations</b> of his own tortured personality.</i>
<b>feel</b>	Feelings of heightened emotion. <i>Fans will undoubtedly get the <b>feels</b> when they see how things haven't changed.</i>
<b>feeling</b>	An emotional state or reaction. <i>She says I have a <b>feeling</b> for medicine.</i>
<b>flavour</b>	A substance used to alter or enhance the taste of food or drink a flavouring. <i>The yoghurt comes in eight fruit <b>flavours</b>.</i>
<b>gloriole</b>	A halo or aureole.
<b>glory</b>	The splendour and bliss of heaven. <i>To fight and die for the <b>glory</b> of one's nation.</i>
<b>halo</b>	A circle of white or coloured light around the sun, moon, or other luminous body caused by refraction through ice crystals in the atmosphere. <i>A <b>halo</b> of smoke.</i>
<b>impression</b>	An impressionistic portrayal of a person. <i>A copy of the first <b>impression</b>.</i>
<b>mood</b>	The atmosphere or pervading tone of something. <i>A concept album which captures the <b>mood</b> of modern times.</i>
<b>nimbus</b>	A light, colour, etc., that surrounds someone or something. <i>A <b>nimbus</b> of power played around him brighter than lightning.</i>
<b>overtone</b>	A musical tone which is a part of the harmonic series above a fundamental note, and may be heard with it. <i><b>Overtones</b> of despair.</i>
<b>quality</b>	A distinctive attribute or characteristic possessed by someone or something. <i>A man of <b>quality</b>.</i>
<b>spirit</b>	A volatile liquid, especially a fuel, prepared by distillation. <i>Aviation <b>spirit</b>.</i>
<b>suggestion</b>	Persuasion formulated as a suggestion. <i>There was a <b>suggestion</b> of a smile on his lips.</i>



- tenor** A part written for a tenor voice.  
A **tenor** sax.
- tone** A musical interval of two semitones.  
*They don't feel he gives the place **tone**.*
- undertone** A subdued or muted tone of sound or colour.  
*The sexual **undertones** of most advertising.*

### **aerodynamics**

The properties of a solid object regarding the manner in which air flows around it.

*The plane has the **aerodynamics** of a brick once the forward thrust is lost.*

Expose to fresh air.

*We cannot **air** this X rated song.*

### **airy**

Not treating something as serious; casual.

*A large **airy** room.*

### **ambience**

A particular environment or surrounding influence.

*The relaxed **ambience** of the cocktail lounge is popular with guests.*

<b>atmosphere</b>	A unit of pressure equal to mean atmospheric pressure at sea level, 101,325 pascals. <i>Part of the sun's energy is absorbed by the earth's <b>atmosphere</b>.</i>
<b>aureole</b>	A circle of light or brightness surrounding something, especially as depicted in art around the head or body of a person represented as holy. <i>Her hair framed her face in a golden <b>aureole</b>.</i>
<b>barometric</b>	Relating to atmospheric pressure or indicated by a barometer. <b>Barometric</b> pressure.
<b>corona</b>	The rarefied gaseous envelope of the sun and other stars The sun's corona is normally visible only during a total solar eclipse when it is seen as an irregularly shaped pearly glow surrounding the darkened disc of the moon.
<b>downdraft</b>	A strong downward air current.
<b>ecosystem</b>	(in general use) a complex network or interconnected system. <i>The marine <b>ecosystem</b> of the northern Gulf had suffered irreparable damage.</i>
<u><b>glory</b></u>	Praise, worship, and thanksgiving offered to a deity. <i>Readers tended to defend their paper or even to <b>glory</b> in its bias.</i>
<b>halo</b>	Surround with or as if with a halo. <i>A <b>halo</b> of smoke.</i>
<b>intangibility</b>	The quality of being intangible and not perceptible by touch.
<b>miasma</b>	An unpleasant or unhealthy smell or vapour. <i>The novel spun a <b>miasma</b> of death and decay.</i>
<b>mood</b>	The atmosphere or pervading tone of something. <i>He was obviously in a <b>mood</b>.</i>
<u><b>mystical</b></u>	Relating to or resembling mysticism. <b>Mystical</b> intuition.
<b>ozone</b>	A colourless unstable toxic gas with a pungent odour and powerful oxidizing properties, formed from oxygen by electrical discharges or ultraviolet light. It differs from normal oxygen (O <sub>2</sub> ) in having three atoms in its molecule (O <sub>3</sub> ).
<b>pneumatic</b>	An item of pneumatic equipment. <i>A tattoo of a <b>pneumatic</b> girl.</i>
<u><b>sensibility</b></u>	Sensitivity to sensory stimuli. <i>The study of literature leads to a growth of intelligence and <b>sensibility</b>.</i>
<b>silence</b>	Complete absence of sound. <i>Sirens pierce the <b>silence</b> of the night.</i>

<b>solar</b>	Relating to or derived from the sun or utilizing the energies of the sun. <i><b>Solar</b> radiation.</i>
<b>spirit</b>	Infuse with spirit. <i>His <b>spirit</b> rose.</i>
<b>stratosphere</b>	The layer of the earth's atmosphere above the troposphere, extending to about 50 km above the earth's surface (the lower boundary of the mesosphere). <i>Her next big campaign launched her into the fashion <b>stratosphere</b>.</i>
<b>troposphere</b>	The lowest atmospheric layer; from 4 to 11 miles high (depending on latitude).
<b>vaporization</b>	Annihilation by vaporizing something.
<b>warmth</b>	The quality, state, or sensation of being warm; moderate heat. <i>The <b>warmth</b> of the sun on her skin.</i>
<b>wind</b>	Catch the scent of get wind of. <i>The river <b>winds</b> through the hills.</i>
<u><a href="#">windy</a></u>	Using or containing too many words. <i>A <b>windy</b> bluff.</i>
<b>zephyr</b>	A soft gentle breeze.
