Definitions of "Aura" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “aura” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A warning sensation experienced before an attack of epilepsy or migraine.*
- *Any invisible emanation, especially an odour.*
- *(in spiritualism and some forms of alternative medicine) a supposed emanation surrounding the body of a living creature and regarded as an essential part of the individual.*
- *The distinctive atmosphere or quality that seems to surround and be generated by a person, thing, or place.*
- *An indication of radiant light drawn around the head of a saint.*
- *A sensation (as of a cold breeze or bright light) that precedes the onset of certain disorders such as a migraine attack or epileptic seizure.*
- *A distinctive but intangible quality surrounding a person or thing.*

air	Air regarded as necessary for breathing. <i>The air was stale.</i>
<u>ambience</u>	A particular environment or surrounding influence. <i>The relaxed ambience of the cocktail lounge is popular with guests.</i>
aspect	The beginning or duration or completion or repetition of the action of a verb. <i>A greenhouse with a southern aspect.</i>
atmosphere	The mass of air surrounding the Earth. <i>These beetles breed best in a damp atmosphere.</i>
aureole	The outermost region of the sun's atmosphere; visible as a white halo during a solar eclipse. <i>Her hair framed her face in a golden aureole.</i>
character	A characteristic especially one that assists in the identification of a species. <i>The Greek alphabet has 24 characters.</i>
<u>climate</u>	A region with a particular climate. <i>Our cold wet climate.</i>

colour	A badge cap or other item in the distinctive colours of a particular school awarded to a pupil selected to represent the school in a sport. <i>A town full of colour and character.</i>
colouring	Appearance with regard to colour. <i>The salon concentrates purely on colouring.</i>
complexion	Texture and appearance of the skin of the face. <i>A liberal political complexion.</i>
emanation	The origination of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. <i>She saw the insults as emanations of his own tortured personality.</i>
feel	Feelings of heightened emotion. <i>Fans will undoubtedly get the feels when they see how things haven't changed.</i>
feeling	An emotional state or reaction. <i>She says I have a feeling for medicine.</i>
flavour	A substance used to alter or enhance the taste of food or drink a flavouring. <i>The yoghurt comes in eight fruit flavours.</i>
gloriole	A halo or aureole.
glory	The splendour and bliss of heaven. <i>To fight and die for the glory of one's nation.</i>
halo	A circle of white or coloured light around the sun, moon, or other luminous body caused by refraction through ice crystals in the atmosphere. <i>A halo of smoke.</i>
impression	An impressionistic portrayal of a person. <i>A copy of the first impression.</i>
mood	The atmosphere or pervading tone of something. <i>A concept album which captures the mood of modern times.</i>
nimbus	A light, colour, etc., that surrounds someone or something. <i>A nimbus of power played around him brighter than lightning.</i>
overtone	A musical tone which is a part of the harmonic series above a fundamental note, and may be heard with it. <i>Overtones of despair.</i>
quality	A distinctive attribute or characteristic possessed by someone or something. <i>A man of quality.</i>
spirit	A volatile liquid, especially a fuel, prepared by distillation. <i>Aviation spirit.</i>
suggestion	Persuasion formulated as a suggestion. <i>There was a suggestion of a smile on his lips.</i>

- tenor** A part written for a tenor voice.
A **tenor** sax.
- tone** A musical interval of two semitones.
*They don't feel he gives the place **tone**.*
- undertone** A subdued or muted tone of sound or colour.
*The sexual **undertones** of most advertising.*



Usage Examples of "Aura" as a noun

- *Muddy colours in the aura indicate negative emotions.*
- *There was a faint aura of disinfectant.*
- *Emotional, mental, and spiritual levels form an energy field around the body known as the aura.*

A rod, wire, or other structure by which signals are transmitted or received as part of a radio or television transmission or receiving system.

*An intrepid **aerial** adventurer.*

aerodynamics

The properties of a solid object regarding the manner in which air flows around it.

*The plane has the **aerodynamics** of a brick once the forward thrust is lost.*

air

Expose to fresh air.

*We cannot **air** this X rated song.*

airy

Not treating something as serious; casual.

*A large **airy** room.*

ambience

A particular environment or surrounding influence.

*The relaxed **ambience** of the cocktail lounge is popular with guests.*

atmosphere	A unit of pressure equal to mean atmospheric pressure at sea level, 101,325 pascals. <i>Part of the sun's energy is absorbed by the earth's atmosphere.</i>
aureole	A circle of light or brightness surrounding something, especially as depicted in art around the head or body of a person represented as holy. <i>Her hair framed her face in a golden aureole.</i>
barometric	Relating to atmospheric pressure or indicated by a barometer. Barometric pressure.
corona	The rarefied gaseous envelope of the sun and other stars The sun's corona is normally visible only during a total solar eclipse when it is seen as an irregularly shaped pearly glow surrounding the darkened disc of the moon.
downdraft	A strong downward air current.
ecosystem	(in general use) a complex network or interconnected system. <i>The marine ecosystem of the northern Gulf had suffered irreparable damage.</i>
<u>glory</u>	Praise, worship, and thanksgiving offered to a deity. <i>Readers tended to defend their paper or even to glory in its bias.</i>
halo	Surround with or as if with a halo. <i>A halo of smoke.</i>
intangibility	The quality of being intangible and not perceptible by touch.
miasma	An unpleasant or unhealthy smell or vapour. <i>The novel spun a miasma of death and decay.</i>
mood	The atmosphere or pervading tone of something. <i>He was obviously in a mood.</i>
<u>mystical</u>	Relating to or resembling mysticism. Mystical intuition.
ozone	A colourless unstable toxic gas with a pungent odour and powerful oxidizing properties, formed from oxygen by electrical discharges or ultraviolet light. It differs from normal oxygen (O ₂) in having three atoms in its molecule (O ₃).
pneumatic	An item of pneumatic equipment. <i>A tattoo of a pneumatic girl.</i>
<u>sensibility</u>	Sensitivity to sensory stimuli. <i>The study of literature leads to a growth of intelligence and sensibility.</i>
silence	Complete absence of sound. <i>Sirens pierce the silence of the night.</i>

solar	Relating to or derived from the sun or utilizing the energies of the sun. <i>Solar radiation.</i>
spirit	Infuse with spirit. <i>His spirit rose.</i>
stratosphere	The layer of the earth's atmosphere above the troposphere, extending to about 50 km above the earth's surface (the lower boundary of the mesosphere). <i>Her next big campaign launched her into the fashion stratosphere.</i>
troposphere	The lowest atmospheric layer; from 4 to 11 miles high (depending on latitude).
vaporization	Annihilation by vaporizing something.
warmth	The quality, state, or sensation of being warm; moderate heat. <i>The warmth of the sun on her skin.</i>
wind	Catch the scent of get wind of. <i>The river winds through the hills.</i>
<u>windy</u>	Using or containing too many words. <i>A windy bluff.</i>
zephyr	A soft gentle breeze.
