auspicious	Giving or being a sign of future success. <i>He was respectful to his auspicious customers.</i>
cheerfulness	The quality of causing happiness. His cheerfulness made everyone feel better.
<u>crimson</u>	(of a person's face) become flushed, especially through embarrassment. $\ensuremath{\textit{Crimson}}$ with fury.
<u>destined</u>	(usually followed by `to') governed by fate. A flight destined for New York.
<u>destiny</u>	The hidden power believed to control future events; fate. We are helpless in the face of destiny .
divination	The practice of seeking knowledge of the future or the unknown by supernatural means. The mediums are hired to perform divination s.
<u>fate</u>	An event (or a course of events) that will inevitably happen in the future. <i>Fate</i> decided his course for him.
<u>favorable</u>	Inclined to help or support; not antagonistic or hostile. The days were fair and the winds were favorable .
felicitate	Congratulate. <i>The award winner was felicitated by the cultural association.</i>
flushed	Having the pinkish flush of health. Her flushed cheeks.
foreknowledge	Awareness of something before it happens or exists. There was the foreknowledge of every role she would dance.
<u>fortunate</u>	Materially well off; prosperous. It was fortunate that the weather was good.
<u>fortune</u>	A large amount of money or assets. <i>He inherited a substantial fortune.</i>
hope	Grounds for feeling hopeful about the future. I hope she understands that she cannot expect a raise.
hopefully	In a hopeful manner. <i>He rode on hopefully.</i>
<u>kismet</u>	The will of Allah. What chance did I stand against kismet .
lucky	Having or bringing good fortune. <i>Lucky stars.</i>
<u>miraculous</u>	Peculiarly fortunate or appropriate; as if by divine intervention. A miraculous cure.



optimism	Hopefulness and confidence about the future or the success of something. The talks had been amicable and there were grounds for optimism .
<u>optimistic</u>	Expecting the best in this best of all possible worlds. <i>Previous estimates of whale numbers may be wildly optimistic.</i>
prophesy	Say that (a specified thing) will happen in the future. Jacques was prophesy ing a bumper harvest.
<u>propitious</u>	Giving or indicating a good chance of success; favourable. There were points on which they did not agree moments in which she did not seem propitious .
providential	Relating to or characteristic of providence- M.R.Cohen. <i>His appearance had seemed more than just</i> providential .
rosy	Presaging good fortune. Life could never be rosy for them.
ruddy	Make ruddy in colour. A cheerful pipe smoking man of ruddy complexion.
<u>superstition</u>	Excessively credulous belief in and reverence for the supernatural. <i>He dismissed the ghost stories as mere</i> superstition .
tallow	Smear something especially the bottom of a boat with tallow. I tallow ed my boats with our candles.
<u>upbeat</u>	A contented state of being happy and healthy and prosperous. <i>He was upbeat about the company s future.</i>
want	Hunt or look for want for a particular reason. Your former neighbor is want ed by the FBI.
<u>wish</u>	A thing that is or has been wished for. We wish ed for peace.
