cheerfulness The quality of causing happiness.

crimson (of a person's face) become flushed, especially through embarrassment.

Crimson with fury.

destined (usually followed by `to') governed by fate.

A flight **destined** for New York.

The hidden power believed to control future events; fate.

We are helpless in the face of **destiny**.

The practice of seeking knowledge of the future or the unknown by

divination supernatural means.

The mediums are hired to perform **divination**s.

An event (or a course of events) that will inevitably happen in the future.

Fate decided his course for him.

favorable Inclined to help or support; not antagonistic or hostile.

The days were fair and the winds were **favorable**.

felicitate Congratulate.

The award winner was **felicitate**d by the cultural association.

Having the pinkish flush of health.

flushed Her flushed cheeks.

foreknowledge Awareness of something before it happens or exists.

There was the **foreknowledge** of every role she would dance.

fortunate Materially well off; prosperous.

It was **fortunate** that the weather was good.

fortune A large amount of money or assets. *He inherited a substantial fortune.*

ne innernea a substantial **jortune**.

hope Grounds for feeling hopeful about the future.

I hope she understands that she cannot expect a raise.

hopefully In a hopeful manner.

He rode on **hopefully**.

kismet The will of Allah.

What chance did I stand against **kismet**.

lucky Having or bringing good fortune.

Lucky stars.

miraculous Peculiarly fortunate or appropriate; as if by divine intervention.

A **miraculous** cure.



optimism

Hopefulness and confidence about the future or the success of something.

The talks had been amicable and there were grounds for **optimism**.

optimistic Expecting the best in this best of all possible worlds.

Previous estimates of whale numbers may be wildly optimistic.

prophesySay that (a specified thing) will happen in the future.

Jacques was **prophesy**ing a bumper harvest.

Giving or indicating a good chance of success; favourable.

propitious There were points on which they did not agree moments in which she did

not seem **propitious**.

providential Relating to or characteristic of providence- M.R.Cohen.

His appearance had seemed more than just **providential**.

rosy Presaging good fortune.

Life could never be **rosy** for them.

ruddy Make ruddy in colour.

A cheerful pipe smoking man of **ruddy** complexion.

superstition Excessively credulous belief in and reverence for the supernatural.

He dismissed the ghost stories as mere **superstition**.

Smear something especially the bottom of a boat with tallow.

I tallowed my boats with our candles.

A contented state of being happy and healthy and prosperous.

He was **upbeat** about the company s future.

want Hunt or look for want for a particular reason.

Your former neighbor is **want**ed by the FBI.

wish A thing that is or has been wished for.

We **wish**ed for peace.
