aegis	Armor plate that protects the chest; the front part of a cuirass. <i>The negotiations were conducted under the aegis of the UN.</i>
protection	Protection money paid to criminals especially on a regular basis. <i>A protection racket.</i>

Usage Examples of "Auspices" as a noun

- *The tournament was held under the auspices of the city council.*

Associations of "Auspices" (30 Words)

auspicious	Giving or being a sign of future success. <i>He was respectful to his auspicious customers.</i>
cheerfulness	The quality of causing happiness. <i>His cheerfulness made everyone feel better.</i>
crimson	(of a person's face) become flushed, especially through embarrassment. <i>Crimson with fury.</i>
destined	(usually followed by 'to') governed by fate. <i>A flight destined for New York.</i>
destiny	The hidden power believed to control future events; fate. <i>We are helpless in the face of destiny.</i>
divination	The practice of seeking knowledge of the future or the unknown by supernatural means. <i>The mediums are hired to perform divinations.</i>
fate	An event (or a course of events) that will inevitably happen in the future. <i>Fate decided his course for him.</i>
favorable	Inclined to help or support; not antagonistic or hostile. <i>The days were fair and the winds were favorable.</i>
felicitate	Congratulate. <i>The award winner was felicitated by the cultural association.</i>
flushed	Having the pinkish flush of health. <i>Her flushed cheeks.</i>
foreknowledge	Awareness of something before it happens or exists. <i>There was the foreknowledge of every role she would dance.</i>
fortunate	Materially well off; prosperous. <i>It was fortunate that the weather was good.</i>
fortune	A large amount of money or assets. <i>He inherited a substantial fortune.</i>
hope	Grounds for feeling hopeful about the future. <i>I hope she understands that she cannot expect a raise.</i>
hopefully	In a hopeful manner. <i>He rode on hopefully.</i>
kismet	The will of Allah. <i>What chance did I stand against kismet.</i>
lucky	Having or bringing good fortune. <i>Lucky stars.</i>
miraculous	Peculiarly fortunate or appropriate; as if by divine intervention. <i>A miraculous cure.</i>

optimism	Hopefulness and confidence about the future or the success of something. <i>The talks had been amicable and there were grounds for optimism.</i>
<u>optimistic</u>	Expecting the best in this best of all possible worlds. <i>Previous estimates of whale numbers may be wildly optimistic.</i>
prophecy	Say that (a specified thing) will happen in the future. <i>Jacques was prophesying a bumper harvest.</i>
<u>propitious</u>	Giving or indicating a good chance of success; favourable. <i>There were points on which they did not agree moments in which she did not seem propitious.</i>
providential	Relating to or characteristic of providence- M.R.Cohen. <i>His appearance had seemed more than just providential.</i>
rosy	Presaging good fortune. <i>Life could never be rosy for them.</i>
ruddy	Make ruddy in colour. <i>A cheerful pipe smoking man of ruddy complexion.</i>
<u>superstition</u>	Excessively credulous belief in and reverence for the supernatural. <i>He dismissed the ghost stories as mere superstition.</i>
tallow	Smear something especially the bottom of a boat with tallow. <i>I tallowed my boats with our candles.</i>
<u>upbeat</u>	A contented state of being happy and healthy and prosperous. <i>He was upbeat about the company's future.</i>
want	Hunt or look for want for a particular reason. <i>Your former neighbor is wanted by the FBI.</i>
<u>wish</u>	A thing that is or has been wished for. <i>We wished for peace.</i>
