personal history	A short newspaper article about a particular person or group.

Associations of "Autobiography" (30 Words)



<u>anecdote</u>	Short account of an incident (especially a biographical one. <i>His wife s death has long been the subject of rumour and anecdote.</i>
<u>article</u>	The definite or indefinite article. It may be worth taking article s in a specialized firm.
author	Be the author of a book or piece of writing. She author ed this play.
biographical	(of data or a written work) dealing with a particular person's life. Biographical data.
biography	An account of the series of events making up a person's life. The basic difference of approach to auto biography and biography .
<u>book</u>	A literary composition that is published or intended for publication as a book. They got a subpoena to examine our book s.
coauthor	A writer who collaborates with others in writing something.
diary	A personal journal (as a physical object. The City Diary .
editor	A person responsible for the editorial aspects of publication the person who determines the final content of a text especially of a newspaper or magazine. A sports editor.
<u>elicit</u>	Deduce (a principle) or construe (a meaning. The work elicit ed enormous public interest.
<u>journal</u>	Write in a journal or diary. <i>He reads the medical journals.</i>
memoir	An account of the author's personal experiences. A revealing passage from Khrushchev s memoir s.
<u>narrate</u>	Narrate or give a detailed account of. The story is narrate d by the heroine.
nonfiction	Prose writing that is not fictional.
<u>nostalgic</u>	A nostalgic person. He remained nostalgic about the good old days.
novel	The literary genre represented or exemplified by novels. <i>His bookcases were filled with nothing but novels.</i>
poet	A writer of poems the term is usually reserved for writers of good poetry. <i>He is more poet than academic because of his gift for language.</i>



<u>publish</u>	Prepare and issue (a book, journal, piece of music, etc.) for public sale, distribution, or readership. Publish a magazine or newspaper.
publisher	A person engaged in publishing periodicals or books or music. <i>The publishers of Vogue.</i>
recall	An act or instance of officially recalling someone or something. A recall of Parliament.
recollect	Recall knowledge from memory have a recollection. <i>He could not quite recollect the reason.</i>
recollection	A thing recollected; a memory. A biography based on his wife s recollection s.
remember	Keep in mind for attention or consideration. <i>He remembered how he used to pick flowers.</i>
remembrance	The action of remembering the dead. A chapel of remembrance .
reminder	Someone who gives a warning so that a mistake can be avoided. <i>He ignored his wife s reminders.</i>
reminiscence	A mental impression retained and recalled from the past. His first works are too full of reminiscence s of earlier poetry.
<u>scribe</u>	Mark with a pointed instrument. He scribe d a note that he passed to Dan.
travelogue	A film or illustrated lecture on traveling.
<u>write</u>	Create code write a computer program. She write s code faster than anybody else.
<u>writer</u>	A clerk, especially in the navy or in government offices. <i>Dickens was a prolific writer</i> .
