Synonyms of "Autobiography" as a noun (4 Words)

account of one's life Importance or value.

life story The period from the present until death.

memoirs An essay on a scientific or scholarly topic.

personal history A short newspaper article about a particular person or group.

Usage Examples of "Autobiography" as a noun

- *He gives a vivid description of his childhood in his autobiography.*
- *The book is a curious mixture of autobiography and fantasy.*

Associations of "Autobiography" (30 Words)

<u>anecdote</u>	Short account of an incident (especially a biographical one). <i>His wife's death has long been the subject of rumour and anecdote.</i>
<u>article</u>	The definite or indefinite article. <i>It may be worth taking articles in a specialized firm.</i>
author	Be the author of a book or piece of writing. <i>She authored this play.</i>
biographical	(of data or a written work) dealing with a particular person's life. <i>Biographical data.</i>
biography	An account of the series of events making up a person's life. <i>The basic difference of approach to autobiography and biography.</i>
<u>book</u>	A literary composition that is published or intended for publication as a book. <i>They got a subpoena to examine our books.</i>
coauthor	A writer who collaborates with others in writing something.
diary	A personal journal (as a physical object). <i>The City Diary.</i>
editor	A person responsible for the editorial aspects of publication the person who determines the final content of a text especially of a newspaper or magazine. <i>A sports editor.</i>
<u>elicit</u>	Deduce (a principle) or construe (a meaning). <i>The work elicited enormous public interest.</i>
<u>journal</u>	Write in a journal or diary. <i>He reads the medical journals.</i>
memoir	An account of the author's personal experiences. <i>A revealing passage from Khrushchev's memoirs.</i>
<u>narrate</u>	Narrate or give a detailed account of. <i>The story is narrated by the heroine.</i>
nonfiction	Prose writing that is not fictional.
<u>nostalgic</u>	A nostalgic person. <i>He remained nostalgic about the good old days.</i>
<u>novel</u>	The literary genre represented or exemplified by novels. <i>His bookcases were filled with nothing but novels.</i>
poet	A writer of poems the term is usually reserved for writers of good poetry. <i>He is more poet than academic because of his gift for language.</i>

<u>publish</u>	Prepare and issue (a book, journal, piece of music, etc.) for public sale, distribution, or readership. <i>Publish a magazine or newspaper.</i>
publisher	A person engaged in publishing periodicals or books or music. <i>The publishers of Vogue.</i>
recall	An act or instance of officially recalling someone or something. <i>A recall of Parliament.</i>
recollect	Recall knowledge from memory have a recollection. <i>He could not quite recollect the reason.</i>
<u>recollection</u>	A thing recollected; a memory. <i>A biography based on his wife s recollections.</i>
remember	Keep in mind for attention or consideration. <i>He remembered how he used to pick flowers.</i>
remembrance	The action of remembering the dead. <i>A chapel of remembrance.</i>
reminder	Someone who gives a warning so that a mistake can be avoided. <i>He ignored his wife s reminders.</i>
reminiscence	A mental impression retained and recalled from the past. <i>His first works are too full of reminiscences of earlier poetry.</i>
<u>scribe</u>	Mark with a pointed instrument. <i>He scribed a note that he passed to Dan.</i>
travelogue	A film or illustrated lecture on traveling.
<u>write</u>	Create code write a computer program. <i>She writes code faster than anybody else.</i>
<u>writer</u>	A clerk, especially in the navy or in government offices. <i>Dickens was a prolific writer.</i>
