- *Convert (a process or facility) to be operated by largely automatic equipment.*

computerized Control a function, process, or creation by a computer.

mechanized Make monotonous; make automatic or routine.

| database | A structured set of data held in a computer, especially one that is accessible in various ways. <i>Database systems.</i> |

| dysfunctional | (of a trait or condition) failing to serve an adjustive purpose. <i>An emotionally dysfunctional businessman.</i> |
| electronic | Of or relating to electronics concerned with or using devices that operate on principles governing the behavior of electrons. <i>The electronic edition of the newspaper.</i> |
| electronically | By means of electronic equipment or devices. <i>Molecules that can accept energy to form electronically excited states.</i> |
| fax | Send a document by fax. <i>Please fax the agreement to me.</i> |
| galvanism | Electricity produced by chemical action. |
| hardware | (computer science) the mechanical, magnetic, electronic, and electrical components making up a computer system. <i>High tech military hardware.</i> |
| intercom | A communication system linking different rooms within a building or ship etc. <i>The pilot s voice comes over the intercom.</i> |
| interlock | The act of interlocking or meshing. <i>A cotton interlock in black or plum.</i> |
| invent | Make up (an idea, name, story, etc.), especially so as to deceive someone. <i>I did not have to invent any tales about my past.</i> |
| kinetoscope | A device invented by Edison that gave an impression of movement as an endless loop of film moved continuously over a light source with a rapid shutter; precursor of the modern motion picture. |
| mechanical | Relating to or concerned with machinery or tools. <i>A major overhaul of the mechanicals.</i> |
| microprocessor | Integrated circuit semiconductor chip that performs the bulk of the processing and controls the parts of a system. <i>A disk drive contains a microprocessor to handle the internal functions of the drive.</i> |
| mover | A person whose job is to remove and transport furniture from one house to another. <i>Movers and seconders rise and give speeches.</i> |
| newfangled | (of a new kind or fashion) gratuitously new. <i>Newfangled ideas.</i> |
| repairman | A person who repairs vehicles, machinery, or appliances. <i>A TV repairman.</i> |
| robot | A person who behaves in a mechanical or unemotional manner. <i>Waiting at a robot I caught the eye of a young woman.</i> |

- robotic** Of or relating to mechanical robots.
*His **robotic** voice.*
- semiconductor** A solid substance that has a conductivity between that of an insulator and that of most metals either due to the addition of an impurity or because of temperature effects. Devices made of semiconductors notably silicon are essential components of most electronic circuits.
- server** A person assisting the celebrant at the celebration of the Eucharist.
*The software runs on a variety of Unix **servers**.*
- software** Written programs or procedures or rules and associated documentation pertaining to the operation of a computer system and that are stored in read/write memory.
