According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "automatic" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Resembling the unthinking functioning of a machine.*
- *(especially of a legal sanction) given or imposed as a necessary and inevitable result of a fixed rule or particular set of circumstances.*
- *(of a firearm) self-loading and able to fire continuously until the ammunition is exhausted or the pressure on the trigger is released.*
- *(of a motor vehicle or its transmission) using gears that change by themselves*

according to speed and acceleration.

- *Done or occurring as a matter of course and without debate.*
- *Operating with minimal human intervention; independent of external control.*
- *Without volition or conscious control.*
- *Done or occurring spontaneously, without conscious thought or attention.*
- *(of a device or process) working by itself with little or no direct human control.*

machinelike	Resembling the unthinking functioning of a machine. <i>Machinelike efficiency.</i>
<u>mechanical</u>	Relating to mechanics as a science. <i>Mechanical design.</i>
mechanized	Made mechanical in character. <i>Mechanized factories emerged in the mid nineteenth century.</i>
necessary	Absolutely essential. <i>The necessary consequences of one's actions.</i>
preprogrammed	(of an electronic device) having been programmed in advance. <i>The app includes several preprogrammed colour settings.</i>
reflex	(of a thought) directed or turned back upon the mind itself; introspective. <i>A reflex knee jerk.</i>
reflexive	Of a verb or clause having a reflexive pronoun as its object e.g wash oneself. <i>Sneezing is reflexive.</i>
<u>robotic</u>	Relating to or of the nature of robots. <i>His robotic voice.</i>

robotlike	Resembling or suggestive of a robot.
routine	Performed as part of a regular procedure rather than for a special reason. <i>The Ministry insisted that this was just a routine annual drill.</i>
<u>subconscious</u>	Of or concerning the part of the mind of which one is not fully aware but which influences one's actions and feelings. <i>My subconscious fear.</i>
<u>unavoidable</u>	Impossible to avoid or evade. <i>An unavoidable accident.</i>
unconditioned	Not established by conditioning or learning. <i>Waste in its raw unconditioned form.</i>
<u>unconscious</u>	Unaware of. <i>He would wipe back his hair in an unconscious gesture of annoyance.</i>
<u>unemotional</u>	Not having or showing strong feelings. <i>A flat unemotional voice.</i>
unmanned	Not having or needing a crew or staff. <i>An unmanned level crossing.</i>
unpreventable	Not able to be prevented or avoided. <i>Until now this devastating disease has been unpreventable.</i>
unthinking	Without care or thought for others. <i>She was at pains to correct unthinking prejudices.</i>

reflex	In reflexology a response in a part of the body to stimulation of a corresponding point on the feet hands or head. <i>Sneezing is a reflex action.</i>
<u>robot</u>	A person who behaves in a mechanical or unemotional manner. <i>A robot arm.</i>
<u>robotic</u>	Of or relating to mechanical robots. <i>A robotic device for performing surgery.</i>
synthetic	A synthetic material or chemical especially a textile fibre. <i>Their tears are a bit synthetic.</i>
tripping	Moving easily and quickly; nimble. <i>Walked with a light tripping step.</i>
