- *A way of approaching a problem or making progress towards something.*
- *A broad road in a town or city, typically having trees at regular intervals along its sides.*
- *A line of approach.*
- *A wide street or thoroughfare.*
- *A tree-lined approach to a country house or similar building.*

<b>direction</b>	Something that provides direction or advice as to a decision or course of action. <i>Any dialogue between them is a step in the right <b>direction</b>.</i>
<b>driveway</b>	A road leading up to a private house. <i>They parked in the <b>driveway</b>.</i>
<b>highway</b>	A main road, especially one connecting major towns or cities. <i>A six lane <b>highway</b>.</i>
<b>line</b>	Denoting an image consisting of lines and solid areas with no gradation of tone. <i>The artist s use of clean <b>line</b> and colour.</i>
<b>path</b>	A definition of the order in which an operating system or program searches for a file or executable program. <i>A vegetarian diet could be the <b>path</b> to a longer life.</i>
<b>road</b>	The part of a road intended for vehicles especially in contrast to a verge or pavement. <i>A country <b>road</b>.</i>
<b>route</b>	A way or course taken in getting from a starting point to a destination. <i>The many <b>routes</b> to a healthier diet will be described.</i>
<b>street</b>	The streets of a city viewed as a depressed environment in which there is poverty and crime and prostitution and dereliction. <i>He worked both sides of the <b>street</b>.</i>
<b>thoroughfare</b>	A public road from one place to another. <i>The main <b>thoroughfares</b> are crowded with tourists.</i>
<b>way</b>	A general category of things used in the expression in the way of. <i>My years of acclimatization to British <b>ways</b>.</i>

## Associations of "Avenue" (30 Words)

### asphalt

The pitch used in asphalt sometimes found in natural deposits but usually made by the distillation of crude oil.

***Asphalt** the driveway.*

### **boulevard**

A wide street in a town or city, typically one lined with trees.

*Sunset **Boulevard**.*

### busy

Unavailable for use by anyone else or indicating unavailability engaged is a British term for a busy telephone line.

*Kept getting a **busy** signal.*

### **crisscross**

Marked with crossing lines.

***Crisscross** the sheet of paper.*

### cross

Mark or annotate a cheque typically by drawing a pair of parallel lines across it to indicate that it must be paid into a named bank account.

*The system is a **cross** between a monorail and a conventional railway.*

<b>crossing</b>	The action of crossing something. <i>A stream of cars was waiting for the railway <b>crossing</b> barriers to be opened.</i>
<u><a href="#">crossover</a></u>	The interchange of sections between pairing homologous chromosomes during the prophase of meiosis. <i>A <b>crossover</b> study.</i>
<b>crossroad</b>	A junction where one street or road crosses another.
<b>crosswalk</b>	A marked part of a road where pedestrians have right of way to cross; a pedestrian crossing.
<b>delineation</b>	Representation by drawing or painting etc. <i>The eventual <b>delineation</b> of the border between the two states.</i>
<b>drawbridge</b>	A bridge that can be raised to block passage or to allow boats or ships to pass beneath it. <i>There was a rattle of chains as the <b>drawbridge</b> was lowered.</i>
<b>fordable</b>	Shallow enough to be crossed by walking or riding on an animal or in a vehicle. <i>The stream was <b>fordable</b>.</i>
<b>intersect</b>	(of two or more things) pass or lie across each other. <i>Lines of latitude and longitude <b>intersect</b> at right angles.</i>
<u><a href="#">intersection</a></u>	An act of intersecting. <i>His course is on a direct <b>intersection</b> with ours.</i>
<b>jaywalk</b>	Cross the road at a red light. <i>You <b>jaywalked</b> across a busy four lane street.</i>
<b>junction</b>	Something that joins or connects. <i>Accidents happen at road <b>junctions</b>.</i>
<b>lamppost</b>	A metal post supporting an outdoor lamp (such as a streetlight).
<b>lane</b>	A well-defined track or path; for e.g. swimmers or lines of traffic. <i>DNA from various sources is placed in separate <b>lanes</b> on an electrophoretic gel.</i>
<b>lineation</b>	The division of text into lines. <i>The punctuation and <b>lineation</b> are reproduced accurately.</i>
<u><a href="#">overlap</a></u>	A part or amount which overlaps. <i>There are many <b>overlaps</b> between the approaches.</i>
<u><a href="#">partially</a></u>	Only in part; to a limited extent. <i>The work <b>partially</b> fulfills the function of a historical memoir.</i>

<b>pavement</b>	A horizontal expanse of bare rock or cemented fragments. <i>The <b>pavements</b> and columns of these ancient ruins provided the material for more recent structures.</i>
<b>pedestrian</b>	Lacking inspiration or excitement; dull. <i>A <b>pedestrian</b> bridge.</i>
<b>road</b>	A railroad. <i>The <b>road</b> to fame.</i>
<b>roadway</b>	The part of a bridge or railway used by traffic.
<b>route</b>	Send via a specific route. <i>Proposals have been put forward for a new <b>route</b> around the south of the town.</i>
<b>sidewalk</b>	A paved path for pedestrians at the side of a road; a pavement.
<b>street</b>	The streets of a city viewed as a depressed environment in which there is poverty and crime and prostitution and dereliction. <i>The whole <b>street</b> protested the absence of <b>street</b> lights.</i>
<b>thoroughfare</b>	A road or path forming a route between two places. <i>The middle bedroom is a <b>thoroughfare</b> to the bathroom.</i>
<b>walker</b>	A light enclosing framework (trade name Zimmer) with rubber castors or wheels and handles; helps invalids or the handicapped or the aged to walk. <i>A fell <b>walker</b>.</i>
