Definitions of "Avenue" as a noun

- *A thoroughfare running at right angles to the streets in a city laid out on a grid pattern.*
- *A way of approaching a problem or making progress towards something.*
- *A broad road in a town or city, typically having trees at regular intervals along its sides.*
- *A line of approach.*
- *A wide street or thoroughfare.*
- *A tree-lined approach to a country house or similar building.*

access road	The right to enter.
approach	The temporal property of becoming nearer in time. <i>He lost the hole when his approach rolled over the green.</i>
boulevard	A wide street or thoroughfare. <i>Sunset Boulevard.</i>
broadway	A street in Manhattan that passes through Times Square; famous for its theaters. <i>Fulham Broadway.</i>

direction	Something that provides direction or advice as to a decision or course of action. <i>Any dialogue between them is a step in the right direction.</i>
driveway	A road leading up to a private house. <i>They parked in the driveway.</i>
highway	A main road, especially one connecting major towns or cities. <i>A six lane highway.</i>
line	Denoting an image consisting of lines and solid areas with no gradation of tone. <i>The artist s use of clean line and colour.</i>
path	A definition of the order in which an operating system or program searches for a file or executable program. <i>A vegetarian diet could be the path to a longer life.</i>
<u>road</u>	The part of a road intended for vehicles especially in contrast to a verge or pavement. <i>A country road.</i>
route	A way or course taken in getting from a starting point to a destination. <i>The many routes to a healthier diet will be described.</i>
<u>street</u>	The streets of a city viewed as a depressed environment in which there is poverty and crime and prostitution and dereliction. <i>He worked both sides of the street.</i>
thoroughfare	A public road from one place to another. <i>The main thoroughfares are crowded with tourists.</i>
way	A general category of things used in the expression in the way of. <i>My years of acclimatization to British ways.</i>

asphalt

The pitch used in asphalt sometimes found in natural deposits but usually made by the distillation of crude oil.

Asphalt the driveway.

boulevard

A wide street in a town or city, typically one lined with trees.

Sunset **Boulevard**.

busy

Unavailable for use by anyone else or indicating unavailability engaged is a British term for a busy telephone line.

Kept getting a **busy** signal.

crisscross

Marked with crossing lines.

Crisscross the sheet of paper.

cross

Mark or annotate a cheque typically by drawing a pair of parallel lines across it to indicate that it must be paid into a named bank account.

The system is a **cross** between a monorail and a conventional railway.

crossing	The action of crossing something. <i>A stream of cars was waiting for the railway crossing barriers to be opened.</i>
<u>crossover</u>	The interchange of sections between pairing homologous chromosomes during the prophase of meiosis. <i>A crossover study.</i>
crossroad	A junction where one street or road crosses another.
crosswalk	A marked part of a road where pedestrians have right of way to cross; a pedestrian crossing.
delineation	Representation by drawing or painting etc. <i>The eventual delineation of the border between the two states.</i>
drawbridge	A bridge that can be raised to block passage or to allow boats or ships to pass beneath it. <i>There was a rattle of chains as the drawbridge was lowered.</i>
fordable	Shallow enough to be crossed by walking or riding on an animal or in a vehicle. <i>The stream was fordable.</i>
intersect	(of two or more things) pass or lie across each other. <i>Lines of latitude and longitude intersect at right angles.</i>
<u>intersection</u>	An act of intersecting. <i>His course is on a direct intersection with ours.</i>
jaywalk	Cross the road at a red light. <i>You jaywalked across a busy four lane street.</i>
junction	Something that joins or connects. <i>Accidents happen at road junctions.</i>
lamppost	A metal post supporting an outdoor lamp (such as a streetlight).
lane	A well-defined track or path; for e.g. swimmers or lines of traffic. <i>DNA from various sources is placed in separate lanes on an electrophoretic gel.</i>
lineation	The division of text into lines. <i>The punctuation and lineation are reproduced accurately.</i>
<u>overlap</u>	A part or amount which overlaps. <i>There are many overlaps between the approaches.</i>
<u>partially</u>	Only in part; to a limited extent. <i>The work partially fulfills the function of a historical memoir.</i>

pavement	A horizontal expanse of bare rock or cemented fragments. <i>The pavements and columns of these ancient ruins provided the material for more recent structures.</i>
<u>pedestrian</u>	Lacking inspiration or excitement; dull. <i>A pedestrian bridge.</i>
<u>road</u>	A railroad. <i>The road to fame.</i>
roadway	The part of a bridge or railway used by traffic.
route	Send via a specific route. <i>Proposals have been put forward for a new route around the south of the town.</i>
sidewalk	A paved path for pedestrians at the side of a road; a pavement.
<u>street</u>	The streets of a city viewed as a depressed environment in which there is poverty and crime and prostitution and dereliction. <i>The whole street protested the absence of street lights.</i>
thoroughfare	A road or path forming a route between two places. <i>The middle bedroom is a thoroughfare to the bathroom.</i>
walker	A light enclosing framework (trade name Zimmer) with rubber castors or wheels and handles; helps invalids or the handicapped or the aged to walk. <i>A fell walker.</i>
