- *(often followed by `for') ardently or excessively desirous.*
- *Marked by active interest and enthusiasm.*

- anxious for** Causing or fraught with or showing anxiety.
- ardent** Very enthusiastic or passionate.
*From rank to rank she darts her **ardent** eyes.*
- avid for** Ardently or excessively desirous.
- dedicated** Solemnly dedicated to or set apart for a high purpose.
***Dedicated** to the proposition that all men are created equal.*
- devoted** Given over to the display, study, or discussion of.
*There is a museum **devoted** to her work.*
- devouring** (of an unpleasant feeling) totally absorbing.
*A **devouring** sense of loneliness.*
- eager** Having or showing keen interest or intense desire or impatient expectancy.

enthusiastic	Having or showing great excitement and interest. <i>Was enthusiastic about taking ballet lessons.</i>
esurient	Hungry or greedy. <i>The esurient eyes of an avid curiosity.</i>
fanatical	Obsessively concerned with something. <i>Her husband was fanatical about tidiness.</i>
<u>fervent</u>	Having or displaying a passionate intensity. <i>A fervent desire to change society.</i>
fervid	Extremely hot- Nathaniel Hawthorne- Frances Trollope. <i>His fervid protestations of love.</i>
greedy	Ardently or excessively desirous. <i>He scoffed at the lot the greedy pig.</i>
greedy for	Wanting to eat or drink more than one can reasonably consume.
hungry for	Feeling hunger; feeling a need or desire to eat food.
<u>insatiable</u>	Of a person having an insatiable appetite or desire for something especially sex. <i>An insatiable demand for old buildings to restore.</i>
keen	Very good. <i>I have keen eyesight.</i>
keen for	Having a sharp cutting edge or point.
keen on	Having or demonstrating ability to recognize or draw fine distinctions.
passionate	Having, showing, or caused by strong feelings or beliefs. <i>He is passionate about football.</i>
ravening for	Excessively greedy and grasping.
thirsty for	Feeling a need or desire to drink.
<u>voracious</u>	Devouring or craving food in great quantities. <i>Paying taxes to voracious governments.</i>
<u>zealous</u>	Marked by active interest and enthusiasm. <i>The council was extremely zealous in the application of the regulations.</i>

*John spake unto him and **desired** him in like manner and contestation as before.*
- desirous** Having or expressing desire for something.
***Desirous** of high office.*
- eager** Having or showing keen interest or intense desire or impatient expectancy.
***Eager** to learn.*

eagerly	In a keenly expectant or interested manner. <i>The news was eagerly awaited.</i>
earnest	Earnest. <i>An earnest student.</i>
enthusiasm	Something that arouses enthusiasm. <i>Her energy and enthusiasm for life.</i>
enthusiast	An ardent and enthusiastic supporter of some person or activity. <i>A sports car enthusiast.</i>
enthusiastic	Having or showing intense and eager enjoyment, interest, or approval. <i>Enthusiastic crowds filled the streets.</i>
envious	Feeling or showing envy. <i>An envious glance.</i>
fanaticism	Excessive intolerance of opposing views. <i>The dangers of religious fanaticism.</i>
fervid	Hot, burning, or glowing. <i>Set out when the fervid heat subsides.</i>
fever	The state of being emotionally aroused and worked up.
grasping	Immoderately desirous of acquiring e.g. wealth. <i>A grasping old miser.</i>
greedy	Having or showing an intense and selfish desire for wealth or power. <i>He scoffed the lot the greedy pig.</i>
intensity	The quality of being intense. <i>He adjusted the intensity of the sound.</i>
jealous	(of God) demanding faithfulness and exclusive worship. <i>The men were proud of their achievements and jealous of their independence.</i>
jealousy	The state or feeling of being jealous. <i>A sharp pang of jealousy.</i>
lecherous	Given to excessive indulgence in sexual activity. <i>She ignored his lecherous gaze.</i>
miserly	Of or characteristic of a miser. <i>His miserly great uncle proved to be worth nearly 1 million.</i>
moneylender	A person whose business is lending money to others who pay interest.
passion	Strong and barely controllable emotion. <i>She nurses a passion for Thomas.</i>
passionate	Having, showing, or caused by strong feelings or beliefs. <i>Passionate pleas for help.</i>

- prehensile** Adapted for grasping especially by wrapping around an object.
*Poets those gifted strangely **prehensile** men.*
- rapacious** Living by preying on other animals especially by catching living prey.
*A **rapacious** appetite.*
- torrid** Full of passion arising from sexual love.
*Hot trumpets and **torrid** rhythms.*
- zeal** Excessive fervor to do something or accomplish some end.
*They disliked his **zeal** in demonstrating his superiority.*
- zealotry** Excessive intolerance of opposing views.
*He expressed concern about religious **zealotry** playing an increasing role in politics.*
- zealous** Marked by active interest and enthusiasm.
*The council was extremely **zealous** in the application of the regulations.*
