<b>bide</b>	Remain or stay somewhere. <i>How long must I <b>bide</b> here to wait for the answer.</i>
<b>cling</b>	A clingstone peach. <i>We sat <b>clinging</b> on to one another.</i>
<b>defer</b>	Hold back to a later time. <i>The judge <b>deferred</b> sentence until 5 April for background reports.</i>
<b>deferment</b>	Act of putting off to a future time. <i>He was granted five <b>deferments</b> from the draft.</i>
<b>delay</b>	An electronic device which introduces a delay especially in an audio signal. <i>The train was <b>delayed</b>.</i>
<b>devour</b>	Eat (food or prey) hungrily or quickly. <i>More and more green space has been <b>devoured</b> by new sprawling estates.</i>
<b>eagerly</b>	With eagerness; in an eager manner. <i>The news was <b>eagerly</b> awaited.</i>
<b>forbear</b>	Refrain from doing or using (something). <i>He modestly <b>forbears</b> to include his own work.</i>
<b>hesitantly</b>	In a tentative or unsure manner. <i>A young guard <b>hesitantly</b> stepped into the room.</i>
<b>hold</b>	Contain or hold have within. <i>Let s hope her luck <b>holds</b>.</i>
<b>lag</b>	Cover with lagging to prevent heat loss. <i><b>Lag</b> pipes.</i>
<b>lingering</b>	Lasting for a long time or slow to end. <i>There are still some <b>lingering</b> doubts in my mind.</i>
<b>passion</b>	Strong and barely controllable emotion. <i>She nurses a <b>passion</b> for Thomas.</i>
<b>patiently</b>	In a way that shows tolerance of delays, problems, or suffering without becoming annoyed or anxious. <i>He <b>patiently</b> explained the pros and cons.</i>
<b>postpone</b>	Cause or arrange for (something) to take place at a time later than that first scheduled. <i>He <b>postponed</b> implementing the scheme until industry and business were consulted.</i>
<b>postponement</b>	The action of postponing something; deferral. <i>The <b>postponement</b> of the elections.</i>
<b>procrastinate</b>	Postpone doing what one should be doing. <i>He <b>procrastinated</b> the matter until it was almost too late.</i>

<b>prorogue</b>	Adjourn by royal prerogative; without dissolving the legislative body. <i>James <b>prorogued</b> this Parliament never to call another one.</i>
<b>queue</b>	Take one's place in a queue. <i>In the war they had <b>queued</b> for food.</i>
<b>reluctant</b>	Unwilling and hesitant; disinclined. <i>Fresh from college and <b>reluctant</b> for the moment to marry him.</i>
<b>reside</b>	Be inherent or innate in. <i>The meaning of an utterance does not wholly <b>reside</b> in the semantic meaning.</i>
<b>restlessly</b>	In a restless manner.
<b>suspend</b>	Hang freely. <i>The sentence was <b>suspended</b> for six months.</i>
<b>temporize</b>	Draw out a discussion or process in order to gain time. <i>The opportunity was missed because the queen still <b>temporized</b>.</i>
<b>uneasily</b>	With anxiety or apprehension. <i>I shifted <b>uneasily</b> in my seat.</i>
<b>wait</b>	A period of waiting. <i>We had a long <b>wait</b>.</i>
