- allure** The quality of being powerfully and mysteriously attractive or fascinating.
*People for whom gold holds no **allure**.*
- amazement** The feeling that accompanies something extremely surprising.
*To her **amazement** Bill was keen.*
- appeal** A serious, urgent, or heartfelt request.
*The popular **appeal** of football.*
- astonishment** The feeling that accompanies something extremely surprising.
*She looked at him in **astonishment**.*
- charisma** A divinely conferred power or talent.
*He has tremendous **charisma** and stage presence.*
- charm** A characteristic property of certain subatomic particles specifically charm quarks charm antiquarks and hadrons containing these expressed as a quantum number.
*The hidden **charms** of the city.*

<u>fascination</u>	The power to fascinate someone; the quality of being fascinating. <i>He had a lifelong fascination with science.</i>
fear	A feeling of anxiety concerning the outcome of something or the safety of someone. <i>They hushed it up out of fear of public reaction.</i>
<u>glamour</u>	Beauty or charm that is sexually attractive. <i>A glamour model.</i>
magic	An illusory feat considered magical by naive observers. <i>He s been working his magic on New Zealand movies for the past two decades.</i>
<u>mystery</u>	The Christian Eucharist. <i>A mystery guest.</i>
reverence	A feeling of profound respect for someone or something. <i>Rituals showed honour and reverence for the dead.</i>
<u>romance</u>	A feeling of excitement and mystery associated with love. <i>The romance from <i>The Gadfly</i> became a popular favourite.</i>
<u>spell</u>	A verbal formula believed to have magical force. <i>A spell of good weather.</i>
veneration	Great respect; reverence. <i>The traditional veneration of saints.</i>
wonder	A thing or a quality of something that causes wonder. <i>He observed the intricacy of the ironwork with the wonder of a child.</i>
wonderment	The feeling aroused by something strange and surprising. <i>Corbett shook his head in silent wonderment.</i>



Usage Examples of "Awe" as a noun

- *They gazed in awe at the small mountain of diamonds.*
- *He stared over the edge with a feeling of awe.*
- *The sight filled me with awe.*
- *Is it any wonder that Christmas Eve has lost its awe?*

*Her house was the **admiration** of everyone.*
- amaze** Be a mystery or bewildering to.
*She **amazed** doctors by fighting back when her deteriorating condition caused her to suffer heart failure.*
- amazement** The feeling that accompanies something extremely surprising.
*She shook her head in **amazement**.*
- astonish** Affect with wonder.
*You never fail to **astonish** me.*
- astonished** Greatly surprised or impressed; amazed.
*We were **astonished** to hear of this decision.*
- astonishment** Great surprise.
*She looked at him in **astonishment**.*

astound	Affect with wonder. <i>Her bluntness astounded him.</i>
<u>bewilderment</u>	A feeling of being perplexed and confused. <i>There was bewilderment at the shift of government policy.</i>
<u>daze</u>	Overcome as with astonishment or disbelief. <i>His mother's death left him in a daze.</i>
<u>disbelief</u>	A rejection of belief. <i>I'll burn in hell for disbelief.</i>
<u>dread</u>	Dreadlocks. <i>Lyon combed his fingers through Curtis dreads.</i>
esteem	An attitude of admiration or esteem. <i>I should esteem it a favour if you could speak to them.</i>
<u>exclamation</u>	A sudden cry or remark expressing surprise, strong emotion, or pain. <i>She gave an exclamation of delight.</i>
<u>flabbergasted</u>	As if struck dumb with astonishment and surprise. <i>The flabbergasted aldermen were speechless.</i>
gasp	Strain to obtain air by gasping. <i>She gave a gasp and fainted.</i>
<u>homage</u>	Special honour or respect shown publicly. <i>Many villagers come here to pay homage to the Virgin.</i>
honor	Bestow honor or rewards upon. <i>We honor checks and drafts.</i>
incredulity	The state of being unwilling or unable to believe something. <i>He stared down the street in incredulity.</i>
<u>inspiring</u>	Having the effect of inspiring someone. <i>He was an inspiring teacher.</i>
<u>motivational</u>	Relating to the reason or reasons for acting or behaving in a particular way. <i>Fear is used as a motivational tool.</i>
mystification	The activity of obscuring people's understanding, leaving them baffled or bewildered.
respect	The state of being admired or respected. <i>She was respected by everyone she worked with.</i>
reverence	Regard with feelings of respect and reverence consider hallowed or exalted or be in awe of. <i>The messenger made his reverence.</i>

scare	Become scared. <i>A bomb scare led them to evacuate the building.</i>
serendipity	The occurrence and development of events by chance in a happy or beneficial way. <i>A fortunate stroke of serendipity.</i>
startle	Cause to feel sudden shock or alarm. <i>He was startled to see a column of smoke.</i>
stupefy	Astonish and shock. <i>The offence of administering drugs to a woman with intent to stupefy her.</i>
surprise	Cause to be surprised. <i>He surprised a gang stealing scrap metal.</i>
surprised	Feeling or showing surprise. <i>There was a surprised silence.</i>
wonder	Something that causes feelings of wonder. <i>A wonder drug.</i>
