
Awed as an Adjective

Definitions of "Awed" as an adjective

- Inspired by a feeling of fearful wonderment or reverence.
- Filled with awe or wonder.





Synonyms of "Awed" as an adjective (3 Words)

awestricken Having or showing a feeling of mixed reverence and respect and wonder and dread.

awestruck

Having or showing a feeling of mixed reverence and respect and wonder and dread.

In grim despair and awestruck wonder.

awful

Inspired by a feeling of fearful wonderment or reverence.

Awful worshippers with bowed heads.





Usage Examples of "Awed" as an adjective

- I watched her in awed silence.
- He spoke in a hushed, awed whisper.
- Awed by the silence.
- Stood in awed silence before the shrine.





Associations of "Awed" (30 Words)

Respect and warm approval. admiration

A small token in **admiration** of your works.

Surprise (someone) greatly; fill with astonishment. **amaze**

He has been amazed by the quality of the employees at the bank.

The feeling that accompanies something extremely surprising. <u>amazement</u>

She shook her head in amazement.

Affect with wonder. astonish

You never fail to **astonish** me.

Filled with the emotional impact of overwhelming surprise or shock. **astonished**

He was **astonished** at the change in him.

Great surprise. astonishment

She looked at him in astonishment.



astound Shock or greatly surprise.

Her bluntness **astound**ed him.

bewilderment Confusion resulting from failure to understand.

The three of them looked at him in **bewilderment**.

daze Overcome as with astonishment or disbelief.

He was walking around in a **daze**.

disbelief A rejection of belief.

Laura shook her head in **disbelief**.

dread Greatly feared dreadful.

He was stricken with the **dread** disease and died.

esteem An attitude of admiration or esteem.

I should **esteem** it a favour if you could speak to them.

exclamation An abrupt excited utterance.

An **exclamation** of amazement.

flabbergasted Greatly surprised or astonished.

Flabbergasted fans took to the streets to celebrate the team s big win.

gasp Strain to obtain air by gasping. She gave a **gasp** and fainted.

homage Formal public acknowledgement of feudal allegiance.

A man doing **homage** to his personal lord.

honor The state of being honored.

A man of **honor**.

incredulity The state of being unwilling or unable to believe something.

He stared down the street in **incredulity**.

inspiring Having the effect of inspiring someone.

The scenery is not very **inspiring**.

motivational Designed to promote the desire or willingness to do or achieve something.

A motivational speech.

mystification The activity of obscuring people's understanding, leaving them baffled or

bewildered.

respect The state of being admired or respected.

The government s record in this **respect** is a mixed one.

Regard with feelings of respect and reverence consider hallowed or exalted

reverence or be in awe of.

The many divine beings **reverence**d by Hindu tradition.

Become scared.

The rapid questions were designed to **scare** her into blurting out the truth.



The occurrence and development of events by chance in a happy or

serendipity beneficial way.

A fortunate stroke of **serendipity**.

Startle Cause to feel sudden shock or alarm. The loud noise startled him awake.

Make dull or stupid or muddle with drunkenness or infatuation.

stupefy The amount they spend on clothes would appal their parents and **stupefy**

their grandparents.

Surprise major.

surprise Cause to be surprised.

Taken unawares or suddenly and feeling wonder or astonishment.

There was a surprised silence

There was a **surprised** silence.

wonder

A thing or a quality of something that causes wonder.

If I feel compassion for her it is not to be wondered at.
