amateurish	Lacking professional skill or expertise. Her amateurish interviewing technique.
ashamed	Embarrassed or guilty because of one's actions, characteristics, or associations. I m ashamed to say I followed him home.
<u>blush</u>	Show shyness, embarrassment, or shame by becoming red in the face. <i>He had brought a faint blush to her cheeks.</i>
bulky	(of a person) heavily built. A bulky carrier bag.
clumsy	Showing lack of skill or aptitude. The legal procedure is far too clumsy .
cumbersome	Slow or complicated and therefore inefficient. A cumbersome piece of machinery.
<u>disgraceful</u>	Shockingly unacceptable. It is disgraceful that they should be denied unemployment benefits.
embarrassing	Causing to feel shame or chagrin or vexation. An embarrassing muddle.
embarrassment	A person or thing causing feelings of embarrassment. <i>I turned red with embarrassment.</i>
<u>flush</u>	The device used for flushing a toilet. The grouse were flush ed from the woods.
forgetful	(of memory) deficient in retentiveness or range. I m a bit forgetful these days.
gaffe	A socially awkward or tactless act. His comments are a major diplomatic gaffe .
gauche	Lacking social polish. Too gauche to leave the room when the conversation became intimate.



gawky	Nervously awkward and ungainly. A gawky lad with long ungainly legs.
graceless	Lacking graciousness. He wanted to speak so as not to seem sullen or graceless .
<u>humiliating</u>	Causing awareness of your shortcomings. A humiliating defeat.
ignominious	Deserving or causing public disgrace or shame. An ignominious retreat.
inelegant	(of language) unpolished. <i>He came skidding to an inelegant halt.</i>
loutish	Ill-mannered and coarse and contemptible in behavior or appearance. The loutish manners of a bully.
maladroit	Not adroit. Both men are unhappy about the maladroit way the matter has been handled.
poser	A person who poses; a poseur.
<u>shame</u>	Bring shame to. She shame d him into making amends.
<u>shameful</u>	Giving offense to moral sensibilities and injurious to reputation- Thackeray. <i>The wicked rascally</i> shameful conduct of the bankrupt.
solecism	A breach of good manners; an instance of incorrect behaviour.
strange	Unusual or surprising; difficult to understand or explain. It is strange how things change.
ungainly	Difficult to handle or manage especially because of shape. An ungainly walk.
<u>unpleasant</u>	(of a person or their manner) unfriendly and inconsiderate; rude. An unpleasant personality.
unskillful	Poorly done. It was an unskillful attempt.
unwieldy	Difficult to use or handle or manage because of size or weight or shape. <i>Huge unwieldy arc lamps.</i>
weird	Strikingly odd or unusual- Bram Stoker. Blue eyes weird ed him out and Ivan s were especially creepy.
