Associations of "Awoke" (30 Words)

afternoon	In the afternoon every afternoon. <i>He spent a quiet afternoon in the park.</i>
awaken	Make someone aware of (something) for the first time. <i>Anna was awakened by the telephone.</i>
bedtime	The usual time when someone goes to bed. <i>It was well past her bedtime.</i>
conscious	Intentionally conceived. <i>A conscious policy.</i>
dawn	Become clear or enter one's consciousness or emotions. <i>Thursday dawned bright and sunny.</i>
day	The part of a day when it is light the time between sunrise and sunset. <i>These days it is not unusual.</i>
daybreak	The time in the morning when daylight first appears; dawn. <i>She set off at daybreak.</i>
doze	Sleep lightly or for a short period of time. <i>I dozed off for a few seconds.</i>
dreaming	A series of mental images and emotions occurring during sleep.
insomnia	Habitual sleeplessness; inability to sleep.
lucid	Showing or having the ability to think clearly, especially in intervals between periods of confusion or insanity. <i>Pelllucid prose.</i>
midnight	12 o'clock at night; the middle of the night. <i>Young children should not be allowed to stay up until midnight.</i>
monday	The second day of the week; the first working day.
morning	Every morning. <i>It was a beautiful sunny morning.</i>

nap	A soft or fuzzy surface texture. <i>There wasn't time for a nap.</i>
night	Nightfall. <i>He watched television every night.</i>
nightmare	A terrifying or deeply upsetting dream. <i>I had nightmares after watching the horror movie.</i>
noon	The middle of the day. <i>The service starts at twelve noon.</i>
oversleep	Sleep longer than intended. <i>We talked until the early hours and consequently I overslept.</i>
rouse	Cause to be agitated excited or roused. <i>She roused and looked around.</i>
sleep	Typically in the context of anticipating a forthcoming event a night or a night's sleep. <i>He didn't get enough sleep last night.</i>
sleepless	Experiencing or accompanied by sleeplessness. <i>Lisa lay sleepless.</i>
slumber	Be asleep. <i>The village street slumbered under the afternoon sun.</i>
sunday	United States evangelist (1862-1935).
tonight	During the night of the present day. <i>Tonight is a night to remember.</i>
wake	Be awake be alert be there. <i>He needs to wake up to reality.</i>
wakeful	Easily disturbed. <i>A restless wakeful night.</i>
waken	Stop sleeping. <i>They combined to waken a forgotten and futile hope.</i>
waking	The state of remaining awake. <i>Worked every moment of my waking hours.</i>
wednesday	The fourth day of the week; the third working day.
