

With one side lower or smaller than the other. lopsided

A **lopsided** grin.

Having an incorrect position or alignment. misaligned

**Misaligned** headlights.

not right Of or belonging to the political or intellectual right.

Neither parallel nor at right angles to a specified or implied line askew

skew crooked.

The picture was **skew**.

skew-whiff Turned or twisted toward one side- G.K.Chesterton. **skewed** Having an oblique or slanting direction or position.

to one side Of the same kind or quality.

Not divisible by two. uneven **Uneven** spacing.

Not straight; crooked or askew.

wonky You have a **wonky** nose and a crooked mouth.

Based on or acting or judging in error. wrong

Something is **wrong** with the engine.

- Away from the correct or expected course.

amiss Wrongly or inappropriately.

Something went badly **amiss** in the preparations.

Turned or twisted to one side.

Rugs lying askew.

**skew-whiff** Turned or twisted to one side.

An unintentional act or remark causing embarrassment to its

**gaffe** originator; a blunder.

His comments are a major diplomatic **gaffe**.

Make an unpowered flight either in a glider or in an aircraft with

**glide** engine failure.

Just within range for a straight **glide** home.

imperfect The imperfect tense.

Drainage here is **imperfect**.

In an imperfect or faulty way.

**imperfectly** MPs represent however **imperfectly** the democratic will of their

electors.

inaccurate Not exact.

A forecast that proved wildly **inaccurate**.

irregular A member of an irregular military force.

His strong **irregular** features.

lopsided Turned or twisted toward one side- G.K.Chesterton.

A **lopsided** grin.

**misquide** Give bad advice to.

A long survey that can only baffle and **misguide** the general reader.

mistake To make a mistake or be incorrect.

Make no **mistake** about his intentions.

misunderstanding An understanding of something that is not correct.

There must have been some kind of **misunderstanding**.

oversight An unintentional omission resulting from failure to notice something.

Was the mistake due to **oversight**.

A reduction in the movement of a pulley or other mechanism due to

**slip** slipping of the belt rope etc.

**solecism** A breach of good manners; an instance of incorrect behaviour.
