- *A male bird or mammal prevented from breeding by a dominant male.*
- *A bachelor apartment.*

bachelor-at-arms	The official symbols of a family, state, etc.
free	People who are free. <i>The home of the free and the brave.</i>
knight bachelor	A chessman shaped to resemble the head of a horse; can move two squares horizontally and one vertically (or vice versa).
<u>single</u>	A single measure of spirits. <i>A singles holiday.</i>
unmarried man	Someone who serves in the armed forces; a member of a military force.

young, free, and single United States religious leader of the Mormon Church after the assassination of Joseph Smith; he led the Mormon exodus from Illinois to Salt Lake City, Utah (1801-1877).

- ex** A man who was formerly a certain woman's husband.
*All his **exes** live in Texas.*
- father** A male parent also used as a term of address to your father.
*John **fathered** four daughters.*
- female** A female person a woman or girl.
***Females** may lay several hundred eggs in two to four weeks.*

fiancee	A woman who is engaged to be married.
girl	A girl or young woman with whom a man is romantically involved. <i>The girls were just learning to ride a tricycle.</i>
girlfriend	Any female friend. <i>His girlfriend kicked him out.</i>
groom	A bridegroom. <i>Star pupils who are groomed for higher things.</i>
guy	Steady or support with a guy wire or cable. <i>The Italians guyed the Tower of Pisa to prevent it from collapsing.</i>
harridan	A scolding (even vicious) old woman. <i>A bullying old harridan.</i>
heterosexual	A heterosexual person someone having a sexual orientation to persons of the opposite sex. <i>Heterosexual relationships.</i>
honeymoon	Spend a honeymoon. <i>The new President s honeymoon period.</i>
husband	Use cautiously and frugally. <i>She husbanded their financial resources through difficult times.</i>
immolate	Offer as a sacrifice by killing or by giving up to destruction. <i>Immolate the valuables at the temple.</i>
male	Of or denoting the sex that produces gametes especially spermatozoa with which a female may be fertilized or inseminated to produce offspring. <i>The male lead.</i>
marital	Of or relating to the state of marriage. <i>Marital status.</i>
marriage	The state of being a married couple voluntarily joined for life (or until divorce). <i>A long and happy marriage.</i>
married	A person who is married. <i>In the seventeenth century science was still married to religion.</i>
mistress	A female head of a household. <i>The cat rubbed itself against its mistress s legs.</i>
octogenarian	A person who is between 80 and 89 years old. <i>The octogenarian is making his TV writing debut.</i>
tomboy	A girl who behaves in a boyish manner.
widow	Become a widow or widower lose one s spouse through death. <i>He was recently widowed.</i>

- widower** A man whose wife is dead especially one who has not remarried.
*Her new found passion has turned me into a tennis **widower**.*
- wife** The wife of a person with a specified occupation.
*He and his **wife** are keen gardeners.*
- woman** A disrespectful form of address to a woman.
*A drawing of a young **woman**.*
