- Someone who takes the place of another (as when things get dangerous or difficult.
- An accumulation caused by clogging or a stoppage.
- Help or support.
- A person or thing that can be called on if necessary; a reserve.
- A copy of a file or other item of data made in case the original is lost or damaged.
- An accumulation of something caused by a blockage, as in traffic or water.
- A copy of a file or directory on a separate storage device.
