mischievousness Reckless or malicious behavior that causes discomfort or annoyance in

others.

naughtiness An attribute of mischievous children.

severeness Excessive sternness.

severity Extreme plainness.

She stared at me with mock **severity**.

diabolical Extremely evil or cruel; expressive of cruelty or befitting hell.

A singer with an absolutely **diabolical** voice.

The state of being held in low esteem.

The ships were a **discredit** to the country.

The snips were a **discredit** to the country.

disrespect A manner that is generally disrespectful and contemptuous.

Growing disrespect for the rule of law.

evil Of a force or spirit embodying or associated with the forces of the devil.

Stories about the **evil** effects of television on children make good copy.

fail Fail to do something leave something undone.

She **fail**ed in her obligations as a good daughter in law.

fiendish Extremely awkward or complex.

Fiendish methods of torture.

gory Covered with blood.

A **gory** dagger.

hellish Extremely evil or cruel; expressive of cruelty or befitting hell.

Hellish weather.

horrible Provoking horror- Winston Churchill.

War is beyond all words **horrible**.

improper

Not suitable or right or appropriate.

It was considered **improper** to leave one s house on Christmas Day.

Immoral or grossly unfair behaviour.

iniquity

A den of iniquity.

mischief A person responsible for harm or annoyance.

Her eyes twinkled with irrepressible **mischief**.



Belonging to an early stage of technical development characterized by

rude simplicity and often crudeness.

Isabel had always been in **rude** health.

In an offensive or bad-mannered way. rudely

She is seen gesturing **rudely** to the paparazzi.

Not conforming to approved standards of social or professional behavior. unethical

It is **unethical** to torment any creature for entertainment.

By bad luck.

unfortunately **Unfortunately** we do not have the time to interview every applicant.

Not fair; marked by injustice or partiality or deception.

unjust An **unjust** accusation.

Moral weakness. vice

Hypocrisy is a particularly sinister vice.

Able or disposed to inflict pain or suffering. vicious

A **vicious** assault.

Intensely or extremely bad or unpleasant in degree or quality. wicked

A wicked prank.

Changed for the worse in health or fitness. **worse**

Her cold is **worse**.
