<b>area</b>	A particular geographical region of indefinite boundary (usually serving some special purpose or distinguished by its people or culture or geography. <i>Rural <b>areas</b> of Britain.</i>
<b>area of activity</b>	A particular environment or walk of life.
<a href="#">branch</a>	A part of a forked or branching shape. <i>Botany is a <b>branch</b> of biology.</i>
<b>department</b>	A specialized sphere of knowledge. <i>He was a bit lacking in the height <b>department</b>.</i>

<u><b>discipline</b></u>	A system of rules of conduct or method of practice. <i>For such a plan to work requires <b>discipline</b>.</i>
<b>domain</b>	The set of possible values of the independent variable or variables of a function. <i>His <b>domain</b> extended into Europe.</i>
<u><b>field</b></u>	A fielder. <i>He planted a <b>field</b> of wheat.</i>
<b>field of study</b>	A geographic region (land or sea) under which something valuable is found.
<b>line</b>	An arrangement of soldiers or ships in a column or line formation a line of battle. <i>You must wait in a long <b>line</b> at the checkout counter.</i>
<u><b>province</b></u>	An area of special knowledge, interest, or responsibility. <i>I made my way home to the dreary <b>provinces</b> by train.</i>
<u><b>sector</b></u>	The minimum track length that can be assigned to store information unless otherwise specified a sector of data consists of 512 bytes. <i>He was helpless in an important <b>sector</b> of his life.</i>
<b>specialism</b>	The concentration of your efforts on a particular field of study or occupation. <i>One of her areas of <b>specialism</b> is police reform.</i>
<u><b>speciality</b></u>	An asset of special worth or utility. <i><b>Speciality</b> potatoes for salads.</i>
<b>specialization</b>	The process of concentrating on and becoming expert in a particular subject or skill. <i>The way different muscles are constructed allows for <b>specialization</b> of function.</i>
<b>specialty</b>	An asset of special worth or utility.
<b>sphere</b>	The apparent surface of the imaginary sphere on which celestial bodies appear to be projected. <i>His social <b>sphere</b> is limited.</i>
<b>study</b>	A thing that is or deserves to be investigated the subject of an individual s study. <i>He knocked lightly on the closed door of the <b>study</b>.</i>
<u><b>subject</b></u>	The subject matter of a conversation or discussion. <i><b>Subjects</b> were asked to complete a questionnaire.</i>
<b>subject area</b>	The subject matter of a conversation or discussion.
<b>subject field</b>	Some situation or event that is thought about.

- *After the war, the Middle East remained his bailiwick.*
- *The warden had the right to arrest all poachers found within his bailiwick.*
