

- Harass with persistent criticism or carping.
- Put bait on (a hook) or in (a trap, net, or fishing area) to entice fish or animals.
- Lure, entice, or entrap with bait.
- Cause dogs to attack (a trapped or restrained animal.
- Attack with dogs or set dogs upon.
