Brave and resolute, especially in a difficult situation. manful

A manful attempt to smile.

Possessing qualities befitting a man. manly

Manly sports.

Willing to face danger. mettlesome

Their horses were beasts of burden not **mettlesome** chargers.

Showing courage. plucky

The **plucky** youngster has astounded medical staff.

Made lively or spirited. **spirited**

A **spirited** campaigner for women s rights.

Having or showing courage and determination. **stout**

Stout walking boots.

Not embarrassed-Jerome Stone. unabashed

A tinseled charm and **unabashed** sentimentality.

Not anxious or concerned. unalarmed An **unalarmed** fire exit door.

Not intimidated or discouraged by difficulty, danger, or disappointment. undaunted

They were **undaunted** by the huge amount of work needed.



undismayed Unshaken in purpose.

Undismayed my mother sent me to a first class crammer for two terms.

unflinching Not shrinking from danger.

He has shown **unflinching** determination throughout the campaign.

unshrinking Not shrinking from danger.

valorous

Showing great courage in the face of danger, especially in battle.

Valorous deeds on the field of honour.
