audacious	Unrestrained by convention or propriety- Los Angeles Times. <i>An audacious interpretation of two Jacobean dramas.</i>
bold	(of a person or their manner) so confident as to be impudent or presumptuous. <i>A coat with bold polka dots.</i>
brave	Ready to face and endure danger or pain; showing courage. <i>His medals made a brave show.</i>
confident	Feeling or showing confidence in oneself or one’s abilities or qualities. <i>This time they re confident of a happy ending.</i>

courageous	Possessing or displaying courage; able to face and deal with danger or fear without flinching. <i>A frank courageous heart triumphed over pain.</i>
daring	Disposed to venture or take risks. <i>He rapidly discovered an audience hungry for his daring new works.</i>
dauntless	Showing fearlessness and determination. <i>Dauntless bravery.</i>
doughty	Brave and persistent. <i>His doughty spirit kept him going.</i>
<u>fearless</u>	Oblivious of dangers or perils or calmly resolute in facing them. <i>Fearless reporters and photographers.</i>
<u>gallant</u>	(of a person or their behaviour) brave; heroic. <i>A gallant gentleman came over and kissed my hand.</i>
<u>heroic</u>	Relating to or characteristic of heroes of antiquity. <i>Heroic sculpture.</i>
<u>intrepid</u>	Fearless; adventurous (often used for rhetorical or humorous effect). <i>Our intrepid reporter.</i>
lionhearted	Brave and determined. <i>A brilliant lionhearted second half comeback.</i>
manful	Brave and resolute, especially in a difficult situation. <i>A manful attempt to smile.</i>
<u>manly</u>	Possessing qualities befitting a man. <i>Manly sports.</i>
mettlesome	Willing to face danger. <i>Their horses were beasts of burden not mettlesome chargers.</i>
plucky	Showing courage. <i>The plucky youngster has astounded medical staff.</i>
<u>spirited</u>	Made lively or spirited. <i>A spirited campaigner for women's rights.</i>
<u>stout</u>	Having or showing courage and determination. <i>Stout walking boots.</i>
<u>unabashed</u>	Not embarrassed- Jerome Stone. <i>A tinsel charm and unabashed sentimentality.</i>
unalarmed	Not anxious or concerned. <i>An unalarmed fire exit door.</i>
undaunted	Not intimidated or discouraged by difficulty, danger, or disappointment. <i>They were undaunted by the huge amount of work needed.</i>

- undismayed** Unshaken in purpose.
***Undismayed** my mother sent me to a first class crammer for two terms.*
- unflinching** Not shrinking from danger.
*He has shown **unflinching** determination throughout the campaign.*
- unshrinking** Not shrinking from danger.
- valorous** Showing great courage in the face of danger, especially in battle.
***Valorous** deeds on the field of honour.*
