eject Leave an aircraft rapidly using an ejection seat or capsule.

**evict** Expel from one's property or force to move out by a legal process.

A single mother and her children have been **evict**ed from their home.

**exclusion** The act of forcing out someone or something.

He had a hand in my **exclusion** from the committee.

A person who lives away from their native country, either from choice or

**exile** compulsion.

The return of political exiles.

**expatriate** Send (a person or money) abroad.

The poet was then **expatriate**d from France.

Force out (something), especially from the body.

She was **expel**led from school.

Hand over (a person accused or convicted of a crime) to the jurisdiction of
