brute	A savagely violent person or animal. <i>A great brute of a machine.</i>

peasant	A poor smallholder or agricultural labourer of low social status (chiefly in historical use or with reference to subsistence farming in poorer countries). <i>Peasants left the farms to work in industry.</i>
savage	A representation of a bearded and semi-naked man with a wreath of leaves. <i>The mother of one of the victims has described his assailants as savages.</i>
tike	A young person of either sex.
troglodyte	Someone who lives in a cave.
tyke	An unpleasant or coarse man. <i>Geordies and tykes have never got on particularly well.</i>
wild man	A wild and uninhabited area left in its natural condition.
wild woman	A wild primitive state untouched by civilization.

atheistic	Disbelieving or lacking belief in the existence of God. <i>Atheistic scientists.</i>
barbaric	Primitive; unsophisticated. <i>Barbaric practices.</i>
barbarous	Able or disposed to inflict pain or suffering. <i>Avoiding barbarous sentences or ambiguities.</i>

heretical	Holding an opinion at odds with what is generally accepted. Heretical beliefs.
idolatrous	Showing extreme admiration or reverence for something. America's idolatrous worship of the auto.
impious	Lacking piety or reverence for a god. Impious toward one's parents.
infidel	Adhering to a religion other than that of the majority. The infidel foe.
neanderthal	Relating to or belonging to or resembling Neanderthal man.
pagan	Relating to pagans or their beliefs. A pagan god.
<u>primitive</u>	Used of preliterate or tribal or nonindustrial societies. Primitive material of the universe.
<u>profane</u>	(of language) blasphemous or obscene. A profane person might be tempted to violate the tomb.
savage	Marked by extreme and violent energy. A savage attack on the government.
sceptical	Not easily convinced; having doubts or reservations. The public were deeply sceptical about some of the proposals.
unbelieving	Rejecting any belief in gods. Drew could only stand there wide eyed and unbelieving .
uncivilised	Without civilizing influences-Margaret Meade.
<u>uncivilized</u>	Without civilizing influences-Margaret Meade. They pitied us for leaving the Smoke for such uncivilized remoteness.
ungodly	Irreligious or immoral. Ungodly lives of lust and pleasure.
<u>unholy</u>	Sinful; wicked. A father killing his son is an act against nature unholy and loathsome.
wild	Produced from wild animals or plants without cultivation. Wild parties.

<u>import</u>	Having important effects or influence. <i>Pronouncements of world shaking import.</i>
inhuman	Not human in nature or character. <i>A babel of inhuman noises.</i>
inhumane	Lacking and reflecting lack of pity or compassion. <i>Confining wild horses is inhumane.</i>
intractable	Hard to control or deal with. <i>The most intractable issue of our era.</i>
out	Directed outward or serving to direct something outward. <i>I ll leave them to fight it out.</i>

outer	A shot that strikes the outer. <i>The outer city bypass.</i>
outside	The region that is outside of something. <i>The dog was still barking outside.</i>
pitiless	(especially of weather) unrelentingly harsh or severe. <i>A night of pitiless rain.</i>
primitive	A painting by a primitive artist or an object in a primitive style. <i>Ohio primitives such as treenware utensils.</i>
reprisal	The forcible seizure of a foreign subject or their goods as an act of retaliation. <i>The threat of reprisal.</i>
ruthless	Without mercy or pity. <i>A ruthless manipulator.</i>
sadistic	Deriving pleasure or sexual gratification from inflicting pain on another. <i>She took a sadistic pleasure in tormenting him.</i>
savage	Subject to a vicious verbal attack; criticize brutally. <i>The decision was a savage blow for the town.</i>
truculence	Obstreperous and defiant aggressiveness.
truculent	Eager or quick to argue or fight; aggressively defiant. <i>A truculent speech against the new government.</i>
uncivilized	Impolite; bad-mannered. <i>Forgive me for my apparent rudeness it was most uncivilized of me.</i>
untamed	Not domesticated or otherwise controlled. <i>Her hair was a tumble of untamed curls.</i>
untutored	Not formally taught or trained. <i>An untutored genius.</i>
vicious	Having the nature of vice. <i>The dog was vicious and likely to bite.</i>
