Definitions of "Bask" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “bask” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Be exposed.*
- *Derive or receive pleasure from; get enjoyment from; take pleasure in.*
- *Revel in and make the most of (something pleasing).*
- *Lie exposed to warmth and light, typically from the sun, for relaxation and pleasure.*



Synonyms of "Bask" as a verb (18 Words)

delight	Take delight in. <i>An experience guaranteed to delight both young and old.</i>
enjoy	Derive or receive pleasure from get enjoyment from take pleasure in. <i>I enjoy watching good films.</i>
glory	Take great pride or pleasure in. <i>Readers tended to defend their paper or even to glory in its bias.</i>
indulge oneself	Yield (to); give satisfaction to.
laze	Spend time in a relaxed, lazy manner. <i>Laze away a long summer day.</i>
lie	(of a thing) rest flat on a surface. <i>An action for restitution would lie for money paid in breach of the law.</i>

loll	Hang loosely or laxly. <i>The two girls lolled in their chairs.</i>
<u>lounge</u>	Sit or recline comfortably. <i>Several students were lounging about reading papers.</i>
luxuriate	Enjoy to excess. <i>She was luxuriating in a long bath.</i>
rejoice	To express great joy. <i>I love to rejoice their poor Hearts at this season.</i>
relax	Cause to feel relaxed. <i>Relax the leg by bringing the knee towards the chest.</i>
<u>relish</u>	Make pleasant to the taste add relish to. <i>We did not relish the idea of a strike.</i>
<u>revel</u>	Get great pleasure from (a situation or experience). <i>Bill said he was secretly revelling in his new found fame.</i>
<u>savor</u>	Derive or receive pleasure from; get enjoyment from; take pleasure in. <i>Savor the soup.</i>
savour	Enjoy or appreciate (something pleasant) to the full, especially by lingering over it. <i>Their gnuiflections savoured of superstition and popery.</i>
<u>sprawl</u>	Sit, lie, or fall with one's arms and legs spread out in an ungainly way. <i>The door shot open sending him sprawling across the pavement.</i>
take pleasure	Take as an undesirable consequence of some event or state of affairs.
wallow	(of a person) indulge in an unrestrained way in (something that one finds pleasurable). <i>I was wallowing in the luxury of the hotel.</i>



Usage Examples of "Bask" as a verb

- *He went on basking in the glory of his first book.*
- *She relished her fame and basked in her glory.*
- *The seals were basking in the sun.*
- *Sprawled figures basking in the afternoon sun.*
- *The seals came ashore to breed and to bask.*



Associations of "Bask" (30 Words)

auroral

Of or relating to the atmospheric phenomenon auroras.
*A dim **auroral** glow.*

beam

Express with a beaming face or smile.
*Notice how broad in the **beam** she s getting.*

blaze

Indicate by marking trees with blazes.
*The **blaze** spread rapidly.*

bright

Made smooth and bright by or as if by rubbing reflecting a sheen or glow.
*A choice of colours from pastels through to **brights**.*

burn

Burn sear or freeze tissue using a hot iron or electric current or a caustic agent.
*Natural gas produces the cleanest **burn** of the lot.*

daytime	The time after sunrise and before sunset while it is light outside. <i>It is easier to make the repairs in the daytime.</i>
flame	Shine or glow like a flame. <i>The car was engulfed in flames.</i>
gleam	Shine brightly, like a star or a light. <i>Her eyes gleamed with satisfaction.</i>
glimmer	A faint or wavering light. <i>The moonlight glimmered on the lawn.</i>
glint	Give out or reflect small flashes of light. <i>His eyes glinted angrily.</i>
glisten	The quality of shining with a bright reflected light. <i>His eyes were glistening.</i>
glitter	Shine with a bright, shimmering reflected light. <i>The blue glitter of the sea.</i>
glow	A steady radiance of light or heat. <i>Her face glowed when she came out of the sauna.</i>
illuminate	Decorate (a building or structure) with lights for a special occasion. <i>Placing the events of the 1930s in a broader historical context helps to illuminate their significance.</i>
illumine	Enlighten (someone) spiritually or intellectually. <i>He moved her lamp so that her face was illuminated.</i>
light	The amount or quality of light in a place. <i>Light headed from lack of sleep.</i>
lucent	Glowing with or giving off light. <i>The lucent moon.</i>
luminescence	The emission of light by a substance that has not been heated, as in fluorescence and phosphorescence. <i>Honey fungus produces a ghostly greenish luminescence.</i>
luminescent	Emitting light not caused by heat. <i>There s something calming about watching a luminescent jellyfish.</i>
phosphorescent	Emitting light without appreciable heat as by slow oxidation of phosphorous. <i>The phosphorescent glow of decaying wood.</i>
photosynthesis	Synthesis of compounds with the aid of radiant energy (especially in plants).
radiation	The energy transmitted by radiation. <i>He was suffering from radiation.</i>

<u>shimmer</u>	Give off a shimmering reflection as of silk. <i>A pale shimmer of moonlight.</i>
shine	Make a surface shine. <i>Tonight he will have a chance to shine and win a world boxing title.</i>
smoulder	Smoke coming from a smouldering fire. <i>Anna smouldered with indignation.</i>
spark	Emit or produce sparks. <i>The trial sparked a furious row.</i>
sunlight	The rays of the sun. <i>A shaft of sunlight.</i>
sunshine	Cheerfulness; happiness. <i>Their colourful music can bring a ray of sunshine.</i>
<u>tan</u>	Convert animal skin into leather by soaking in a liquid containing tannic acid or by the use of other chemicals. <i>A tan baseball cap with orange piping.</i>
ultraviolet	Of equipment or techniques using or concerned with ultraviolet radiation. <i>Ultraviolet radiation.</i>
