Basket as a Noun

Definitions of "Basket" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “basket” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A facility on a website that records items selected by a customer for purchase until the transaction is completed.*
- *A goal scored.*
- *Horizontal circular metal hoop supporting a net through which players try to throw the basketball.*
- *A group or range of currencies or investments.*
- *A container that is usually woven and has handles.*
- *A score in basketball made by throwing the ball through the hoop.*
- *A net fixed on a hoop used as the goal.*
- *The quantity contained in a basket.*
- *A structure suspended from a hot-air balloon for carrying the crew, equipment, and ballast.*
- *A container used to hold or carry things, typically made from interwoven strips of cane or wire.*

basketball hoop	A game played on a court by two opposing teams of 5 players; points are scored by throwing the ball through an elevated horizontal hoop.
basketful	The quantity contained in a basket.
box	The quantity contained in a box. <i>The umpire warned the batter to stay in the batter's box.</i>
case	A set of facts or arguments supporting one side in a legal case. <i>The case against tobacco advertising.</i>
<u>container</u>	An object for holding or transporting something. <i>More containers can run on a server than traditional virtual machines.</i>
field goal	All of the horses in a particular horse race.
handbasket	A container that is usually woven and has handles.
holder	A smallholder. <i>A towel holder.</i>

hoop

Horizontal circular metal hoop supporting a net through which players try to throw the basketball.

*By the official rules of the game a basketball **hoop** must be 18 inches in diameter and 10 feet off the ground.*

receptacle

An electrical socket.

*Fast food **receptacles**.*

vessel

A duct or canal holding or conveying blood or other fluid.

*Lord use this lowly **vessel** let me serve You as You will.*

bowl	The quantity contained in a bowl. <i>A sugar bowl.</i>
<u>bubble</u>	Of a liquid form rising bubbles of gas or air. <i>He didn't want to burst the newcomer's bubble.</i>
<u>bucket</u>	The quantity contained in a bucket. <i>She emptied a bucket of water over them.</i>
cart	Convey or put in a cart or similar vehicle. <i>They carted the piano down three flights of stairs.</i>
case	An agreed summary of the facts relating to a legal case drawn up for review or decision on a point of law by a higher court. <i>In many cases farmers do have a deep feeling for their land.</i>
cased	Enclosed in a case. <i>Knights cased in steel.</i>
collier	A coal miner.
<u>kitchen</u>	A set of fitments and units that are sold together and fixed in place in a kitchen. <i>Kitchen Swahili.</i>
luggage	Suitcases or other bags in which to pack personal belongings for travelling. <i>Carrying emotional luggage from the past.</i>
pail	The quantity contained in a pail.
percolator	A coffeepot in which boiling water ascends through a central tube and filters back down through a basket of ground coffee beans.
pickpocket	A thief who steals from the pockets or purses of others in public places. <i>I think someone pickpocketed me in Brighton on my way to the station.</i>
pocket	Put in one's pocket. <i>Local politicians were found to have been pocketing the proceeds of fund raisers.</i>
pouch	Put into a pouch. <i>The muslin is lightly pouched over the belt.</i>
restroom	A toilet that is available to the public.
sack	Put in a sack. <i>He got the sack for swearing.</i>
shower	Wash oneself in a shower. <i>The guests showered rice on the couple.</i>
soap	Rub soap all over usually with the purpose of cleaning. <i>She soaped her face.</i>

stash	A hiding place or hideout. <i>One prisoner tried to swallow his stash.</i>
<u>storage</u>	Depositing in a warehouse. <i>The chair can be folded flat for easy storage.</i>
<u>suitcase</u>	A portable rectangular container for carrying clothes. <i>Three huge suitcases and a plethora of hand baggage.</i>
toilet	A room or building equipped with one or more toilets. <i>Pensions are in the toilet.</i>
tub	Plant in a tub. <i>A tub of water.</i>
wallet	A bag for holding provisions, especially when travelling, typically used by pedlars and pilgrims.
<u>wash</u>	A quantity of clothes needing to be or just having been washed. <i>The river washed a ravine into the mountainside.</i>
