## Basket as a Noun

### Definitions of "Basket" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “basket” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A facility on a website that records items selected by a customer for purchase until the transaction is completed.*
- *A goal scored.*
- *Horizontal circular metal hoop supporting a net through which players try to throw the basketball.*
- *A group or range of currencies or investments.*
- *A container that is usually woven and has handles.*
- *A score in basketball made by throwing the ball through the hoop.*
- *A net fixed on a hoop used as the goal.*
- *The quantity contained in a basket.*
- *A structure suspended from a hot-air balloon for carrying the crew, equipment, and ballast.*
- *A container used to hold or carry things, typically made from interwoven strips of cane or wire.*



## Synonyms of "Basket" as a noun (11 Words)

<b>basketball hoop</b>	A game played on a court by two opposing teams of 5 players; points are scored by throwing the ball through an elevated horizontal hoop.
<b>basketful</b>	The quantity contained in a basket.
<b>box</b>	The quantity contained in a box. <i>The umpire warned the batter to stay in the batter's <b>box</b>.</i>
<b>case</b>	A set of facts or arguments supporting one side in a legal case. <i>The <b>case</b> against tobacco advertising.</i>
<b><u>container</u></b>	An object for holding or transporting something. <i>More <b>containers</b> can run on a server than traditional virtual machines.</i>
<b>field goal</b>	All of the horses in a particular horse race.
<b>handbasket</b>	A container that is usually woven and has handles.
<b>holder</b>	A smallholder. <i>A towel <b>holder</b>.</i>

<b>hoop</b>	Horizontal circular metal hoop supporting a net through which players try to throw the basketball. <i>By the official rules of the game a basketball <b>hoop</b> must be 18 inches in diameter and 10 feet off the ground.</i>
<b>receptacle</b>	An electrical socket. <i>Fast food <b>receptacles</b>.</i>
<b>vessel</b>	A duct or canal holding or conveying blood or other fluid. <i>Lord use this lowly <b>vessel</b> let me serve You as You will.</i>

**apron**

A garment similar to an apron that is worn as part of official dress as by a bishop or Freemason.

**bath**

An act or process of immersing and washing one's body in the water held by a bath.

**bathe**

Cleanse the entire body.

**bathroom**

A set of matching units to be fitted in a bathroom especially as sold together.

I have to go to the **bathroom**.

**bathtub**

A relatively large open container that you fill with water and use to wash the body.

<b>bowl</b>	The quantity contained in a bowl. <i>A sugar <b>bowl</b>.</i>
<b><u>bubble</u></b>	Of a liquid form rising bubbles of gas or air. <i>He didn't want to burst the newcomer's <b>bubble</b>.</i>
<b><u>bucket</u></b>	The quantity contained in a bucket. <i>She emptied a <b>bucket</b> of water over them.</i>
<b>cart</b>	Convey or put in a cart or similar vehicle. <i>They <b>carted</b> the piano down three flights of stairs.</i>
<b>case</b>	An agreed summary of the facts relating to a legal case drawn up for review or decision on a point of law by a higher court. <i>In many <b>cases</b> farmers do have a deep feeling for their land.</i>
<b>cased</b>	Enclosed in a case. <i>Knights <b>cased</b> in steel.</i>
<b>collier</b>	A coal miner.
<b><u>kitchen</u></b>	A set of fittings and units that are sold together and fixed in place in a kitchen. <i><b>Kitchen</b> Swahili.</i>
<b>luggage</b>	Suitcases or other bags in which to pack personal belongings for travelling. <i>Carrying emotional <b>luggage</b> from the past.</i>
<b>pail</b>	The quantity contained in a pail.
<b>percolator</b>	A coffeepot in which boiling water ascends through a central tube and filters back down through a basket of ground coffee beans.
<b>pickpocket</b>	A thief who steals from the pockets or purses of others in public places. <i>I think someone <b>pickpocketed</b> me in Brighton on my way to the station.</i>
<b>pocket</b>	Put in one's pocket. <i>Local politicians were found to have been <b>pocketing</b> the proceeds of fund raisers.</i>
<b>pouch</b>	Put into a pouch. <i>The muslin is lightly <b>pouched</b> over the belt.</i>
<b>restroom</b>	A toilet that is available to the public.
<b>sack</b>	Put in a sack. <i>He got the <b>sack</b> for swearing.</i>
<b>shower</b>	Wash oneself in a shower. <i>The guests <b>showered</b> rice on the couple.</i>
<b>soap</b>	Rub soap all over usually with the purpose of cleaning. <i>She <b>soaped</b> her face.</i>



- stash** A hiding place or hideout.  
*One prisoner tried to swallow his **stash**.*
- storage** Depositing in a warehouse.  
*The chair can be folded flat for easy **storage**.*
- suitcase** A portable rectangular container for carrying clothes.  
*Three huge **suitcases** and a plethora of hand baggage.*
- toilet** A room or building equipped with one or more toilets.  
*Pensions are in the **toilet**.*
- tub** Plant in a tub.  
*A **tub** of water.*
- wallet** A bag for holding provisions, especially when travelling, typically used by pedlars and pilgrims.
- wash** A quantity of clothes needing to be or just having been washed.  
*The river **washed** a ravine into the mountainside.*
